Board Members Present: President Lori E. Lightfoot, Vice President Ghian Foreman, Eva-Dina Delgado, Michael Eaddy, Steve Flores, John P. O'Malley Jr., John H. Simpson, Rhoda D. Sweeney, and Andrea L. Zopp.

Board Members Absent: None.

Others Present: Superintendent of Police Eddie T. Johnson, General Counsel to the Superintendent Charise Valente, Civilian Office of Police Accountability Interim Chief Administrator Patricia Banks, Police Board Executive Director Max A. Caproni, and members of the public.

President Lightfoot called the meeting to order and welcomed new Police Board Member Andrea L. Zopp, whose appointment to the Board was approved by the City Council on November 21, 2017.

- 1. Mr. Simpson moved to approve the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held on November 16, 2017. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.
- 2. President Lightfoot announced that the schedule of the Board's regular public meetings for 2018 will be posted on the Board's website, and that the Board's next regular public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, January 18, 2018, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters.

Vice President Foreman moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 9 in favor (Lightfoot, Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

- 3. President Lightfoot reported that earlier in the evening the Board, as required by the Illinois Open Meetings Act, met and considered minutes and recordings of all past closed meetings to determine whether the need for confidentiality still exists, and that the Board members unanimously agreed that it continues to be necessary to keep confidential the minutes and recordings of its past closed meetings.
- 4. President Lightfoot stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month appears in the blue books made available at the meeting, and she noted that this report and the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the Board's website.
- 5. President Lightfoot announced that copies of the general orders and other directives issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books made available at the meeting and are accessible on the Police Department's website.
- 6. President Lightfoot noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. Superintendent Johnson reported on several matters, including reductions in gun violence in Chicago during 2017, and the completion of the roll-out of body-worn cameras to all patrol officers. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of Superintendent Johnson's remarks.)
- 7. President Lightfoot called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak. (See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of each speaker's remarks.)
 - John Perryman expressed his concerns about shootings and drug dealing near his home on the border of the 11th and 12th police districts. Superintendent Johnson stated that he would have an officer get Mr. Perryman's contact information so that there can be follow-up on these concerns.
 - David Evans expressed his concerns about crime in his neighborhood on the South Side. Superintendent Johnson responded that the Department is aware of the issues and is taking action to address them. He also asked Mr. Evans to give his contact information to an officer so that there can be follow-up.
 - Helen Henning spoke about a variety of matters.
 - George Blakemore spoke about several matters.
 - Robert More spoke about a variety of matters.
 - President Lightfoot called upon the following individuals and there was no response: Ellen Corely, Crista Noel, and Queen Sister.

POLICE BOARD CITY OF CHICAGO

Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by the Public at Board Meetings

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

- 1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
- 2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
- 3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
- 4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

During the month of **December 2017**, **138** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **27,168** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Body Worn Camera Orientation Program, Force Mitigation/Crisis Recognition & Response, LEMART, C50 Avon Gas Mask Training, Prescribed Weapons Qualifications, Procedural Justice and Legitimacy, Power Test, Patrol Carbine Requalification A, TASER Qualification and Re-Certification, COPA Taser, Firearms Concealed Carry Act Online Course, Body Warn Cameras: Law and Policies, Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) Familiarization, Directives: March 2017, Domestic Violence 4-Part Refresher, First Amendment Online Training, PAPV, POWER Test and Gang Violence Reduction Strategy.

A total of 655 Chicago Police Recruits were in training along with 26 Metropolitan Police Recruits.




