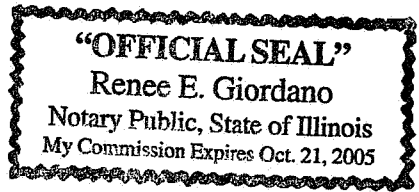

1 Please describe the major features of the project:

44^h Ward Pedestrian Improvements: the scope of work includes the installation of 10 City-standard Victor Stanley benches and 10 precast planters at various locations along Souphport Ave, between Grace and Belmont. The total cost of furnishing, and installation is estimated at \$46,357.000. The deadline for this installation is Summer 2004.

2 Please explain why this project could not be bid using the City's traditional bid process and the need to use the JOC procurement system:

This project is a time-sensitive construction and installation at a small scale. As such, the urgency and efficiency needed to complete the project during the 2004 construction year can best be managed via the JOC process.

This project involves the use of multiple trades for construction and installation.

The use of the JOC process would assist in the management and implementation of this time-sensitive project. By utilizing the JOC process, efficient timing of construction and installation can be maintained for completion during the 2004 construction year.
