Justification for Non-Competitive Procurement Worksheet

PROCUREMENT HISTORY

1. The Chicago Police Department has seven ranges- five at Department Area buildings, two at the Police Academy.
 - 5101 S. Wentworth Area Central-Area 1
 - 727 E. 111th Street Area South-Area 2
 - 2452 W. Belmont Area North Detectives -Area 3
 - 3151 W. Harrison -11th District-Area 4
 - 5555 W. Grand - Area North Patrol-Area 5
 - 1300 W. Jackson -Education and Training Division-Police Academy, North and South Range.

Detroit Armor was the original manufacturer and installer of Police Department firing range components at our seven ranges. Detroit Armor then became MDS Caswell and is now known as Meggitt Training Systems Inc. The firing range components include, target conveying system, range communication system, bullet traps, ballistic baffling, wall deflectors, soundproofing, stalls and the ATO electronic circuit board. Their equipment including the software is proprietary. Until 2012 contract was held with 2FM, formerly DGS. 2FM determined it would be more conducive to have the Police Department manage or oversee this contract. Police was notified the contract had lapsed in 2012 and then the Police Department requested a sole source contract. The Police Department had a vendor (Supertrap) look at the various ranges but the vendor was unable to do anything because of the footprint constraint of the six facilities and proprietary nature of the equipment.

2. No, Meggitt Training Systems Inc was awarded a five-year sole source contract in 2013.

3. Detroit Armor, then became MDS Caswell, then became Meggitt Training Systems Inc, is the original manufacturer and installer of Police Department firing range components at our seven ranges, 5101 S. Wentworth Area Central - Area 1, 727 E. 111th Street Area South-Area 2, 2452 W. Belmont Area North Detectives-Area 3, 3151 W. Harrison - Area 4, 5555 W. Grand -Area 5, and 1300 W. Jackson -Education and Training Division-Police Academy. Detroit Armor then became MDS Caswell and now known at Meggitt Training Systems Inc. It is the original vendor (manufacturer, installer, service provider) of the firing range componets currently in use by the Chicago Police Department. Several years ago, the Police Department had "Supertrap" explore the possibility of maintaining the ranges but because of the existing building footprints and the proprietary nature of the systems components they were unable to submit a quote or bid. For a vendor other than Meggitt to submit a bid would require the replacement of all the range components in all the ranges. Even then the building footprint requires modifications making it difficult for other companies to meet the specific needs of the Police Department.

4. CPD has looked for vendors to maintain the firing range components but have found no authorized dealers to maintain Meggitt proprietary equipment and software. Meggitt Training Systems Inc is not just an installer and service provider but also the manufacturer of the equipment, so even if Police were able to find a vendor to maintain the equipment the vendor would still have to purchase the parts from Meggitt Training Systems Inc. Meggitt does not guarantee the existing system if they do not provide the components and will not be liable for any damages to any MTSI equipment that has been outfitted with other manufacturer's equipment. This liability extends to officer safety in the event of a projectile hitting an officer and the cause is determined to be MTSI equipment, the Department would have no recourse to go after MTSI as they are not maintaining or providing parts to equipment.

5. For future procurements the Police Department at a substantial cost will look to procure a vendor who can manufacture and install a new firing range component system at all seven ranges.

6. The Police Department will look at vendors who can manufacture and install a new target system, ATO circuit

board, wall defectors, bullet traps, ballistic baffles and acoustics, the lanes, range communication system and shooting stalls for all seven ranges at a substantial cost to the City. In addition, because the existing limited footprint of the range, the industry standard is 12 foot from toe of the bullet trap to the back wall, in CPD ranges the measure is 6 foot from toe of the bullet trap to the back wall requiring modifications to components that only Meggitt can do currently.

ESTIMATED COST

1. The total cost is \$1,461,556.00 for maintenance, parts and repair for all Ranges of the Chicago Police Department for a period of five (5) years. For the first year only, major repair is needed at the two Academy Ranges at a cost of \$473,000 to successfully complete training. This includes repairs/replacement parts as follows: target carrier system, shooting stalls, ballistic baffling, target system controls, and computer tablet for target retrieval system. Due to the increased number of PPOs and increased use and frequency of Academy firing ranges, the firing range components require additional repair so that minimal disruption to operational needs is met. The Education and Training Academy needs to be operational to ensure timely training of all Department members. The Academy Range is used for more intensive training for PPOs and in-service training. The Deputy Chief of the Academy requested a proposal for upgrades because of the expanded critical use of the Academy Range facilities and the increased down time due to broken equipment from overuse. The proposal takes into account the increased use and equipment longevity, improving the components and decreasing down time to repair equipment and to meet training schedule requirements.
2. \$197,711 yearly cost for maintenance and parts with the exception of year one. Year one is \$ 670,711.00 including Academy repairs.
3. The current pricing proposal was provided by Meggitt Training Systems Inc.
4. The City and the Meggitt have a substantial investment in the firing ranges. A new vendor would be required to replace the firing range components at each of the seven ranges to include the target carrying systems, bullet traps, ballistic baffles and acoustics, the lanes, range communication system and shooting stalls. The estimated costs of replacing the ranges would be several million dollars. The new systems would have increased costs for manufacturing because the Department's firing ranges have a smaller existing footprint requiring modifications to any components.
5. In the prior sole source contract there was no increase in pricing for the entire length of contract, 10% discount on the price of parts still remains.

SCHEDULE REQUIREMENTS

1. The Education and Training Division and all Area Ranges with exception of 3151 W. Harrison -Area 4, need to be serviced twice a month, totaling twenty-four (24) visits for each of the following locations:
 - 5101 S. Wentworth- Area Central-Area 1 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles,
 - 727 E. 111th Street -Area South-Area 2 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles,
 - 2452 W. Belmont- Area North Detectives- Area 3 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles,
 - 5555 W. Grand -Area North Patrol- Area 5 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles, and
 - 1300 W. Jackson- Education and Training Division-Police Academy Twenty lanes, ATO2003, 2-LE5B Traps, Stalls and baffles.
 - One visit to 3151 W. Harrison-Area 4 Five lanes CEA, LE7500 Trap, is required every three (3) months with a total of four visits yearly.All service visits are to be scheduled in advance to minimize disruption of operational needs and training.
2. Does not apply.
3. The scheduled is determined by the manufacturer to meet specifications and warranty requirements for the components of the targeting system. Maintenance is critical to operational needs of the Department as delays in

training or yearly qualification can result in the Police Department losing its certification from the State of Illinois.

4. Per the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Boards (ILETSB) The police department requires each of its officers to qualify with their firearms on a yearly basis. If this is not met the officers will lose their certification and not be able to fulfill their law enforcement duties to carry a gun. Probationary police officers (PPOs) must complete a (40) forty-hour course of live fire to become certified while in the Academy. This training is essential if these hours are not met PPOs cannot be assigned any law enforcement duties. Officers are also required to qualify with their firearm upon returning to duty following an injury on or off duty. Police officers are also required to attend In-Service training at a range, the timely completion of training is vital to operations of the Department. Based on the recent consent decree there is an expectation of increased in- service training regarding firearms, use of force and sanctity of life. The seven ranges are a crucial part of the operational needs of the Police Department, having any range down seriously impacts the Department's operational ability.

EXCLUSIVE OR UNIQUE CAPABILITY

1. Not Applicable

2. Meggitt Training Systems Inc. can manufacture, design, install, modify and maintain the target systems used in over 13,000 locations worldwide. The components used by Meggitt are proprietary, designed by the company and warrantied by the company exclusively. This includes not only the hardware but also the software used by the ATO target retrieval system. Meggitt not only works with Law Enforcement but also the US Army, US Marines, and the US Air Force. Meggitt technicians are the only ones in the country that can repair the ATO circuit boards due to the proprietary nature of the boards, software and components.

3. Meggitt (Detroit Armor) is the original vendor of the seven Chicago Police Department Firing Ranges. They are the manufacturer, designer, installer, and maintenance provider of the firing range components used including: target system, ATO circuit board, wall defectors, bullet traps, ballistic baffles and acoustics, the lanes, range communication system and shooting stalls. The Firing Ranges do not meet current industry standards requiring modifications to components from the manufacturer which Meggitt is able to do and continue to warranty the equipment and guarantee the components will continue to work with existing equipment.

4. The target system, ATO circuit board, bullet traps, wall defectors, ballistic baffles and acoustics, the lanes, range communication system and shooting stalls designed and manufactured by Meggitt is proprietary to them, not only the components but also the software used in the ATO Target Retrieval System. There is no other manufacturer of this equipment or software.

5. When repair parts are needed Meggitt is the only vendor who can properly shape and weld AR500 steel which requires special techniques, the target system, wall defectors, ATO circuit board, bullet traps, ballistic baffles and acoustics, the lanes, wall defectors, range communication system and shooting stalls designed and manufactured by Meggitt is proprietary to them, not only the components but also the software used in the ATO circuit board. Meggitt technicians are the only ones in the country that can repair the ATO circuit boards due to the proprietary nature of the boards, software and components. There is no other manufacturer of this equipment or software. If another vendor could be found it would entail the replacement of all firing range components in the seven ranges used by the Police impacting the operational needs of the Department adversely and a substantial expense to the City.

6. Meggitt (Detroit Armor) was the original designer of the Firing Ranges used by the Chicago Police Department and is a manufacturer, designer, installer and service provider of the firing range components that include target carrier system, ATO circuit board, wall defectors, bullet traps, ballistic baffles and acoustics, the lanes, range communication system and shooting stalls. The Firing Ranges do not meet current industry standards requiring modifications to components from the manufacturer which Meggitt is able to do and continue to warranty the equipment and guarantee the components will continue to work with existing equipment. Proprietary software and equipment may not be used or sold without authorization by Meggitt Training Systems Inc.

7. Yes, all software on the ranges is proprietary to Meggitt Training Systems Inc. All the components provided have been fabricated and tested by Meggitt at their manufacturing plant. The company will not guarantee any components which they have not provided, or guarantee the equipment will function properly, nor will Meggitt be liable for any

damages to Meggitt Training Systems Inc equipment outfitted with other manufacturers' equipment.

8. All software on the range is Proprietary to Meggitt Training Systems Inc. All the components provided have been fabricated and tested at their facility in Suwanee Ga. They will not guarantee any components which they do not provide will allow the equipment to function properly, nor will they be liable for any damages to any Meggitt Training System Inc equipment that was outfitted with other manufacturers' equipment.



A. SCOPE

The Contractor must provide maintenance, parts and repair service of firing ranges for the Chicago Police Department at the following locations:

- 5101 S. Wentworth- Area Central -Area 1
- 727 E. 111th Street -Area South -Area 2
- 2452 W. Belmont- Area North Detectives -Area 3
- 3151 W. Harrison- 11th District-Area 4
- 5555 W. Grand- Area North Patrol -Area 5
- 1300 W. Jackson -Education and Training Division -Police Academy

All work performed will be done during regular service hours 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday through Saturday, excluding Sunday and any legal holidays. No overtime will be requested or required by the Chicago Police Department.

The Education and Training Division and all Area Ranges with exception of 3151 W. Harrison 11th District (Area 4), need to be serviced twice a month, totaling twenty-four (24) visits for each of the following locations:

- 5101 S. Wentworth- Area Central -Area 1 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles,
- 727 E. 111th Street- Area South -Area 2 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles
- 2452 W. Belmont- Area North Detectives-Area 3 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles
- 5555 W. Grand - Area North Patrol -Area 5 Five lanes, ATO2003, LE5B Trap, Stalls and baffles
- 1300 W. Jackson- Education and Training Division-Police Academy Twenty lanes, ATO2003, 2-LE5B Traps, Stalls and baffles
- One visit to 3151 W. Harrison- 11th District- Area 4 Five lanes CEA, LE7500 Trap, is required every three (3) months with a total of four visits yearly. All service visits are to be scheduled in advance to minimize disruption of operational needs and training.

The work completed at each visit by the certified Meggitt Training Systems technician will include the following services:

1. Test for proper operation of all components of the target conveying systems.
2. Check and adjust drive belts, cables, electrical connection, target stops, carriers, take-up assemblies and all other components of the conveying system not mentioned herein. **Any wheels, hardware, or pulleys necessary will be supplied at an additional charge**
3. Lubricate, as required, all components requiring lubrication.

4. Clean the overhead track system of debris as required.
5. Repair as required any non-functioning target lane or component thereof. **Including electronic assemblies and the master control console.** (On site, only and parts are extra)
6. Inspect all ballistic protection equipment including the bullet trap for improper wear and tear or the accumulation of lead and/or other debris.
7. During work the Meggitt Training Systems technician will provide the customer with basic instructions of maintenance, operation procedures and training on the system.
8. **Range must be closed until maintenance is complete.**

Maintenance Service will include all work and materials delineated herein and any and all peripheral Costs Labor, materials, travel, priority freight charges, transportation, guarantees, warranties, insurance, etc.

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to notify the Department's authorized representative of any conditions that might require repair or adversely impair the proper operation of the firing range.

The Contractor will provide a work schedule for any Scheduled Maintenance Service for the review and approval of the Chicago Police Department or authorized representative.

The Contractor will perform repair service for work not covered under the maintenance service. The Contractor will respond to request for repair service within forty-eight (48) hours of written and/or verbal notification by the Department's authorized representative

Repair service will be billed as follows:

- Number of hours to repair the equipment, and
- Cost of parts to repair the equipment
- The cost of Repair Service is to be billed at a rate of \$135.00 per hour. No additional allowance for overtime and holiday pay.

In the event the equipment is irreparable, the Contractor will provide a written explanation of the problems to the Department and the Department will take the necessary action as to the disposition of the equipment.

Parts, components, assemblies and/or accessories furnished under this contract must be genuine replacement parts as manufactured or supplied by the Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) unless OEM parts, components, assemblies and/or accessories are no longer available.

All part, components and/or accessories furnished that are not OEM are to be considered "Generic" and must be compatible and interchangeable with existing City owned equipment. The Department must be informed of any "generic" parts used and reserves the right to refuse the use of those parts. The cost for any parts, components, assemblies and/or accessories purchased either separately or in conjunction with repair service will be based on the attached Contractor Price list.

The Contractor will also provide major repair to the Police Training Academy's two ranges the first year of the contract located at 1300 W. Jackson. Each Academy range has 10 firing range positions and its own separate control console.

Major Repair services at the two Police Training Academy Ranges to include the following:

- Repairing/replacing all that is necessary to have fully functional target systems and related controls to include target carrier system and computer tablet for target retrieval system
- Upgrades to any mechanical or electrical and operating software
- Removal and proper cleaning for disposal of any removed items
- Repairs/replacement of the existing lane dividers so that they are returned to their fully functional condition to include countertops, shelves, shooters barricades. Includes removal of old equipment items
- Repairs/upgrades to the final row of Re-Directive Guard ceiling panels. If existing panels are not mendable, provider has the option to replace them with panels that must be fabricated from minimum ¼" AR500 Armor Plate steel, including all applicable suspension hardware needed and proper disposal of any removed parts
- The Department at their cost has sole discretion to choose the option of taking any removed parts that are deemed "still usable" and having them stored for use at their other Area Ranges.
- Full install is based on two trips by the Contractor's Field Service Technician and labor crew
- A full factory one year warranty will be provided once the work has been completed
- The Contractor will be provided building access outside normal business hours
- The Contractor will provide training to Department of Police Training Academy Firearms instructors upon completion of installation
- A Quality Control walk thru and final acceptance between the Department and the Contractor will occur once installation is complete

B. INTENT

The intent of this requirement is for the Department of Police to purchase a maintenance, parts and repair service for the Firing Ranges. To ensure officers are able to maintain annual qualifications, officers in-service training and PPO training so all officers will be able to maintain certification with the ILETSB.

The total cost is \$1,461,556 for maintenance, parts and repair for all Ranges of the Chicago Police Department for a period of five (5) years.

For first year only, major repair is needed at the two Academy Ranges at a cost of \$473,000 to successfully complete training. This includes repairs/replacement parts as follows: target carrier system, shooting stalls, ballistic baffling, target system controls, and computer tablet for target retrieval system. Due to the increased number of PPOs and increased use and frequency of Academy firing ranges, the firing range components require additional repair so that minimal disruption to operational needs is met. The Education and Training Academy needs to be operational to ensure timely training of all Department members. The Academy Range is used for more intensive training for PPOs and in-service training. The Deputy Chief of the Academy requested a proposal for upgrades because of the expanded critical use of the Academy Range facilities and the increased down time due to broken equipment from overuse. The proposal

takes into account the increased use and equipment longevity, improving the components and decreasing down time to repair equipment and to meet training schedule requirements.

C. DETAILED DESCRIPTION

The Department of Police is requesting the Contract have the following:

1. Routine maintenance on all Chicago Police secure firing ranges.
2. Proper operation of the target conveying systems.
3. Check and adjust drive belts, cables, electrical connections, target stops, carriers, take-up assemblies and all other components of the conveying system not mentioned herein.
4. Lubricate all components, as required.
5. Repair any non-functioning target lane or component thereof, including electronic assemblies and the master control console, as required.
6. Inspect all ballistic protection equipment including the bullet trap for improper wear and tear or the accumulation of lead and/or other debris
7. During the course of the work the technician will provide basic instruction of maintenance and operation procedures.
8. All maintenance service will be performed by a certified technician.

D. WARRANTY

The Contractor must furnish a warranty for the services/hardware provided under this Contract in accordance with the standard warranty regularly supplied.

At a minimum, the Contractor hereby guarantees for a period of ninety (90) days from the date of final acceptance by the City, that it will, at its own expense and without any cost to the City, replace all defective parts and make any repairs that may be required or made necessary by reason of defective design, material or workmanship, or by reason of non-compliance with these specifications. The guarantee period will commence on the first day the unit is placed in service by the City. If a longer guarantee can be furnished at no additional cost to the City, the longer period will prevail.

E. AUTHORIZED DEALER/DISTRIBUTOR/RESELLER INVOICES

The Contractor must be the manufacturer or an authorized dealer, distributor or reseller of the proposed replacement parts and related accessories and be capable of providing genuine parts, assemblies and accessories as supplied by the original equipment manufacturer (O.E.M.). Further, the Contractor must be capable of furnishing original product warranty and manufacturer's related services such as repair, product information, and product re-call notices, etc.

The Contractor's compliance with these requirements will be determined by the Chief Procurement Officer, whose decision will be binding.

F. DELIVERY

Receiving hours are as needed.

G. MISSHIPMENTS/DEFECTIVE MERCHANDISE

The Contractor will be responsible for any incorrect or damaged shipments and defective merchandise. The Contractor must make arrangements with their common carrier or company personnel to facilitate shipment or pick up of unacceptable parts.

The Contractor must replace the incorrect, damaged or defective merchandise or issue a credit within seven (7) business days of the return. If the replacement merchandise or a credit is not received within seven (7) business days, the City will deduct the amount of the return from any outstanding invoice at the time of payment.

The City of Chicago will not be subject to restocking charges due to Contractor error.
