















PROJECT GOALS

IMPROVE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

- Make it safer and easier for pedestrians to cross the street
- Make pedestrians more visible to motorists and bicyclists

ORGANIZE THE STREET

- Clearly define space on the street for each mode
- Make bicyclists already riding on the street more predictable

ENCOURAGE CONSISTENT & PREDICTABLE VEHICLE SPEEDS

Ensure cars and bicycles are traveling at appropriate speeds

PROVIDE A LOW-STRESS, FAMILY-FRIENDLY EAST/WEST CONNECTION

- Provide another option for people not comfortable walking or biking on busy streets
- Connect to trails, the Lakefront, schools, parks, local businesses & CTA



WHY IS THIS BEING PROPOSED?

- ► COMPLETE STREETS POLICY all Chicagoans deserve to travel safely and comfortably to the places they need to go, no matter how they get around.
- Citywide focus on providing people with SAFE, HEALTHY, LOW-STRESS TRAVEL OPTIONS.
- ► **BICYCLING IS GROWING** and will continue to grow in Chicago. Bicycling along Leland is growing even faster.
- ► LELAND IS ALREADY A POPULAR ROUTE for families and people of all ages and abilities. Extension of the existing Leland Greenway east of Clark.
- CONNECT LINCOLN SQUARE to trails, greenways, the Lakefront, local businesses & CTA.



GREENWAYS USE TRAFFIC CALMING TO

- Make people walking MORE VISIBLE to motorists and bicyclists
- Encourage SAFER & MORE PREDICTABLE SPEEDS for everyone
- Allow vulnerable users, such as children and the elderly, to more SAFELY CROSS THE STREET
- Improve the safety of people walking, biking, and driving by REDUCING THE LIKELINESS AND SEVERITY OF CRASHES in the future
- DISCOURAGE DANGEROUS DRIVING behaviors



NEIGHBORHOOD GREENWAYS

A study of other Neighborhood Greenways in Chicago found...

- CRASHES DECREASED on Neighborhood Greenways
- NUMBER OF BICYCLISTS INCREASED on Neighborhood Greenways, but they are still not as busy as the nearby arterials
- MORE WOMEN AND CHILDREN bike on Neighborhood Greenways than on the nearby arterial streets
- ► BICYCLISTS RIDE SLOWER on Neighborhood Greenways than on the nearby arterial streets


WHAT WE'VE HEARD

We've heard from a lot of folks about the project

- 2019 public meeting
- Neighborhood groups & Chamber of Commerce
- Other emails and messages

Overall positive reception to the Leland Neighborhood Greenway

- This makes sense, people already bike in both directions on Leland.
- Lawrence is not a street I'd feel comfortable riding a bike on
- Some concerns with contraflow bike lane at alleys
- Interest in opportunities for landscaping
- Additional locations for traffic calming identified





WHAT WE'VE HEARD

Cut through traffic and speeding is a problem


 Over the years, the 40th and 47th Wards have received many requests to address cut through traffic on Leland

Improve the design through Lincoln Square

- Improved bicycle comfort through Lincoln Square between Western & Lincoln is needed
- Western Avenue is a barrier which divides the neighborhood and is difficult for people to cross

Better connect to the North Shore Channel Trail

 Need for improvements at Lawrence & Francisco/Virginia and better connection to North Shore Channel Trail

DESIGN UPDATES

What has changed since the last meeting?



ADDITIONAL TRAFFIC CALMING

Since the last meeting, additional traffic calming is added at key intersections identified by the community

- ► Leland & Virginia New concrete bumpout
- ► Leland & Artesian New concrete bumpouts
- Leland & Damen New high visibility green bicycle markings across intersection & increased bike parking





LAWRENCE & FRANCISCO

Changes are coming to the Lawrence & Francisco intersection

- ► To be implemented through the Lawrence Avenue streetscape
- More comfortable for people to walk and bike across Lawrence
- New connection to/from the North Shore Channel Trail for people biking
- Construction anticipated to start in 2022






LELAND – WESTERN TO LINCOLN


We heard the need to improve the design through Lincoln Square and the Western Avenue intersection to make it more comfortable for people of all ages and abilities

We've redesigned this stretch to be more family friendly and completely separate people biking from vehicles

WESTERN AVE BROWN LINE STATION PLAZA

Lincoln Square Chamber of Commerce leading an effort to redesign the Brown Line Station Plaza

- This project could enhance the Leland Greenway between Lincoln and Western
- Concrete curb or sidewalk-level bike lanes could further improve the comfort of people biking through





What we've heard...


- Western Avenue is a barrier which divides the neighborhood and is difficult for people to cross
- Families and children need to cross Western to get to school each day
- The community has called for changes to make this crossing safer over the years
- Improve the design of the greenway across Western to be more family friendly
- Cut through traffic and speeding is a problem on Leland between Virginia/Lawrence and Western
- The 40th and 47th Wards have received many requests to address cut through traffic on Leland





Turning movements

- Most vehicles are coming to Western from the east
- Nearly all westbound vehicles are turning right onto Western from Westbound Leland
- Very few left turns are made from Leland onto Western from either direction
- Eastbound vehicles driving straight through
 Western are likely cut through drivers








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












Design addresses many community concerns

A family friendly design

- Greatly improves the comfort of people walking and biking through the intersection to connect the neighborhood
- Removes all conflicts between people biking and vehicles through the Western intersection
- Removes left turn conflicts for people walking across Western at Leland

Will help discourage cut-through traffic in the neighborhood

- Small number of turning movements impacted
- Street grid and nearby signals allow neighbors to still get wherever they need to go






LELAND & LINCOLN INTERSECTION

The stop sign at Lincoln & Leland will allow people on bikes to transition to and from the protected bike lane

- Green markings help people on bikes ride through the intersection and alert motorists to watch for bikes
- All crosswalks and stop bars will be refreshed
- A left turn box will further help people turn onto Leland heading east
- Potential for additional bike parking, scooter parking, fix-it station, or other amenities
- This requires relocating about two parking spaces
