Community agreements of engagement

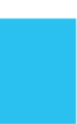
1. Listen actively to understand others' views and perspectives.

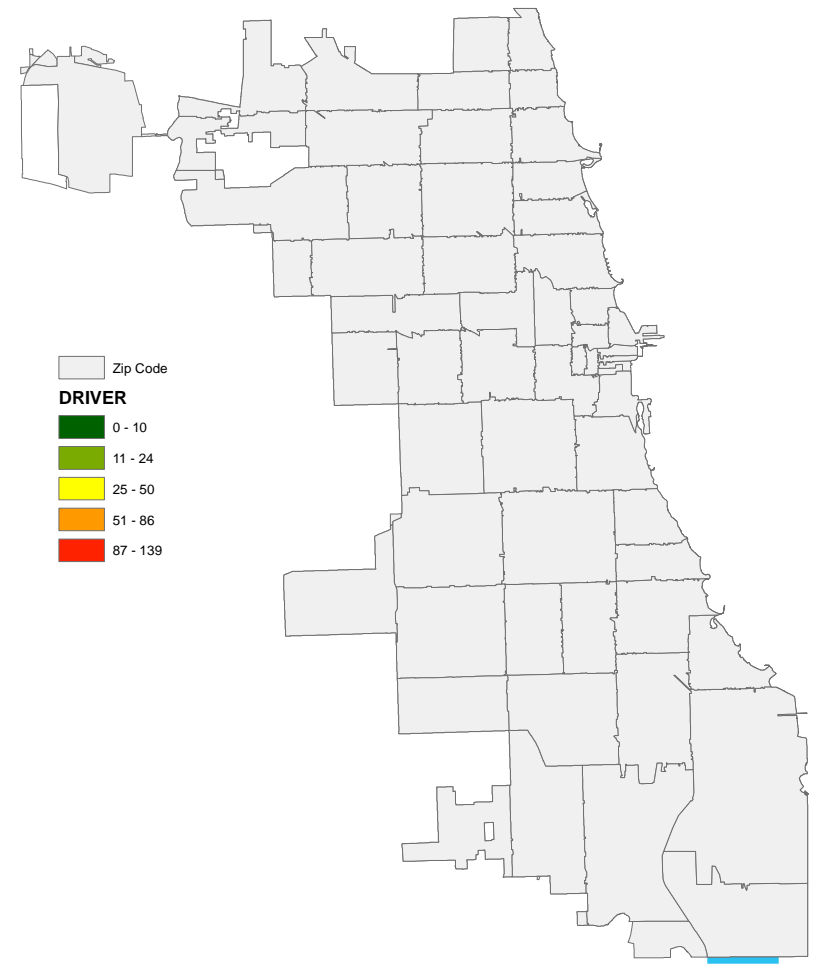

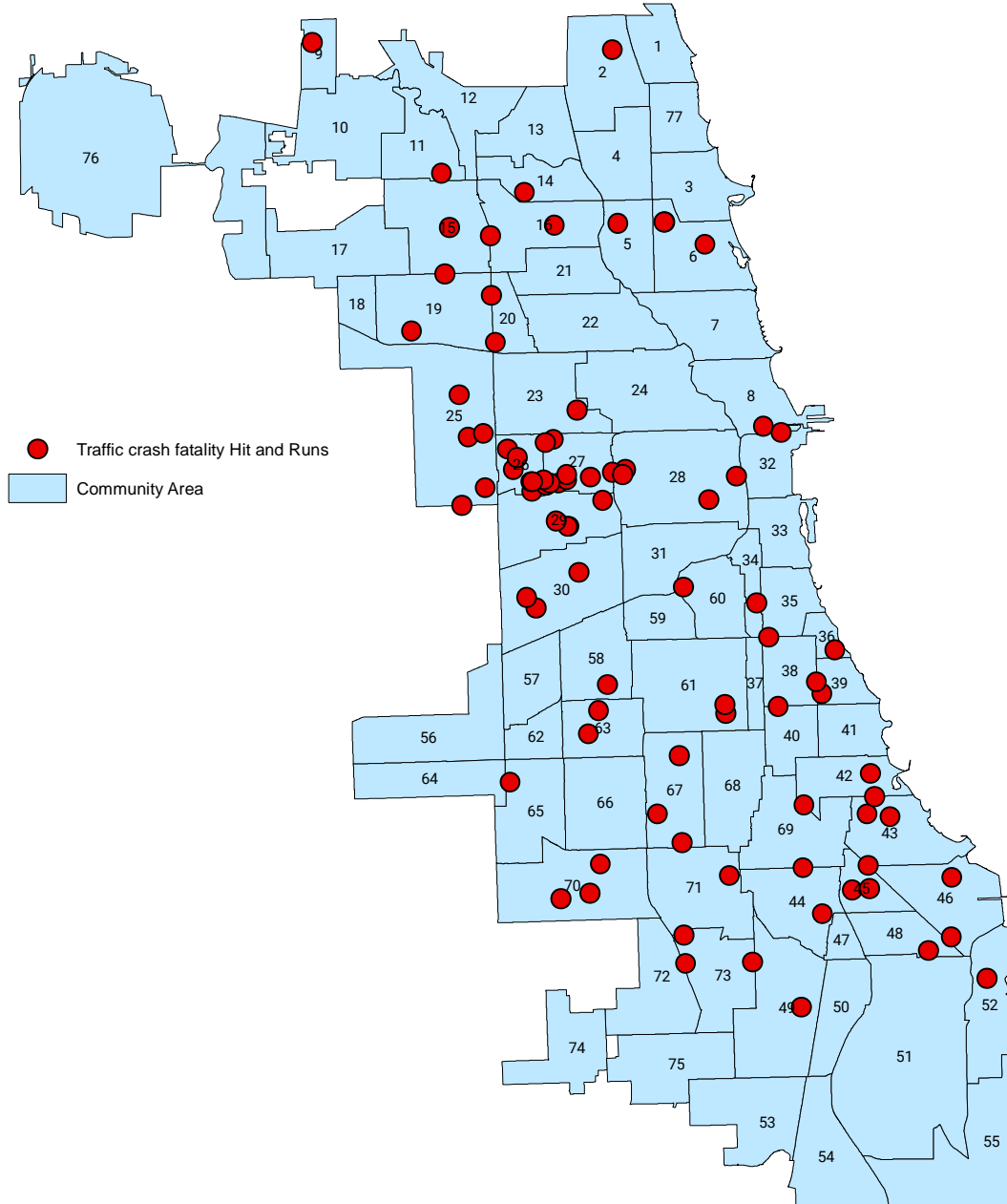
Serious injuries and fatalities from traffic crashes among Chicago residents by zip code, 2020-2022



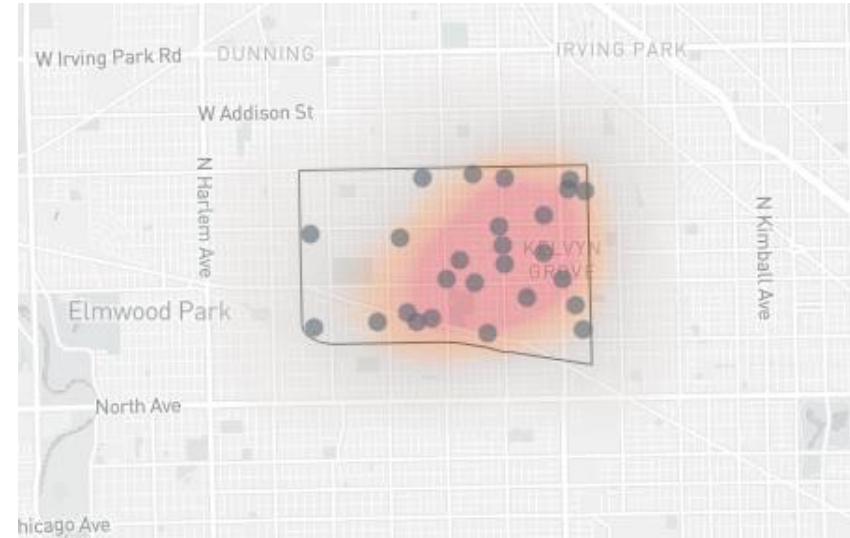

Hit and Runs for Fatal Traffic Crashes

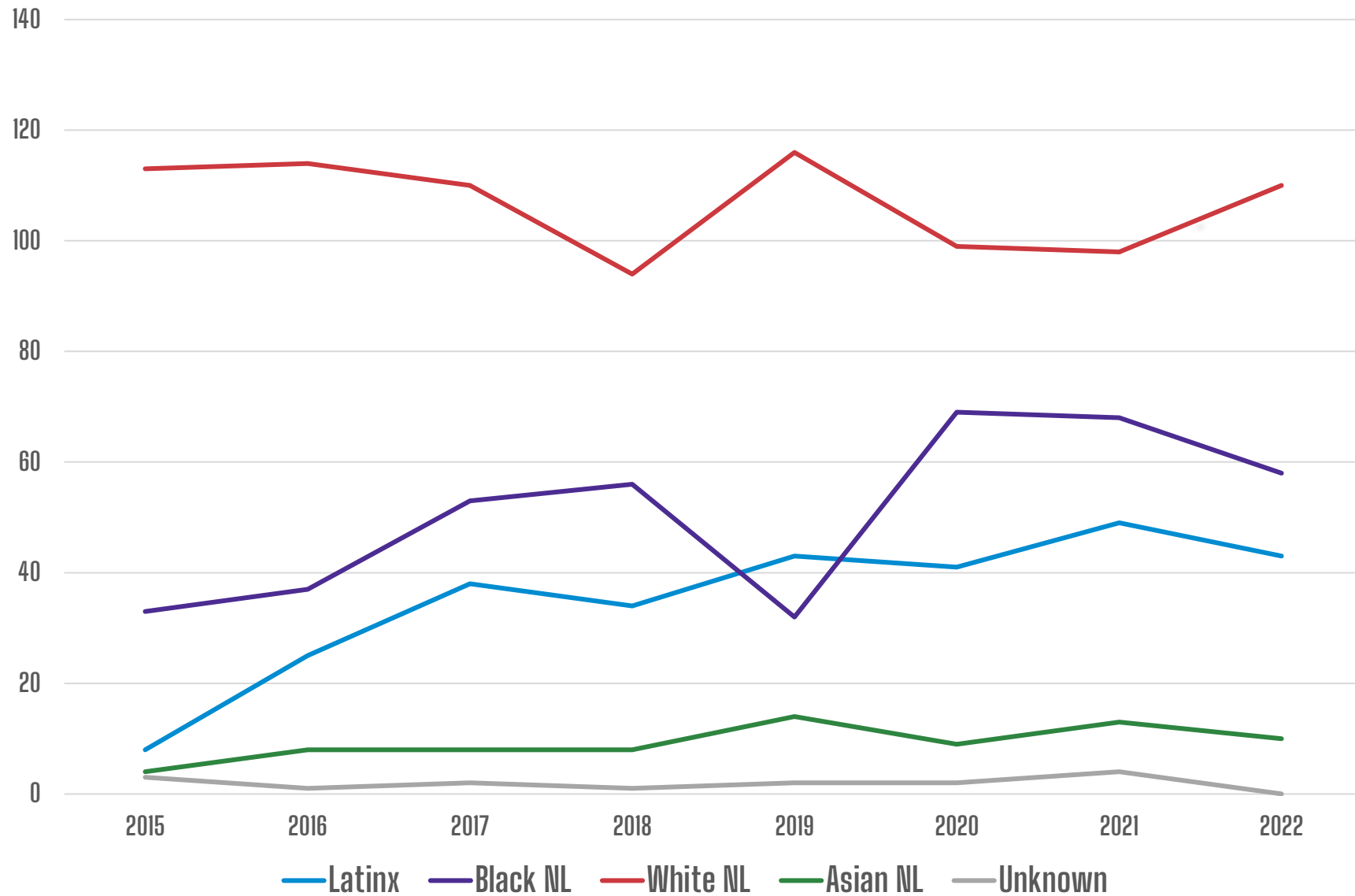


Fatal and non-fatal shootings in Belmont Cragin, 2022



➤ Significant rise in suicide mortality among Blacks NL and Latinx populations

Suicide Mortality by race/ethnicity among Chicago residents, 2015-2022



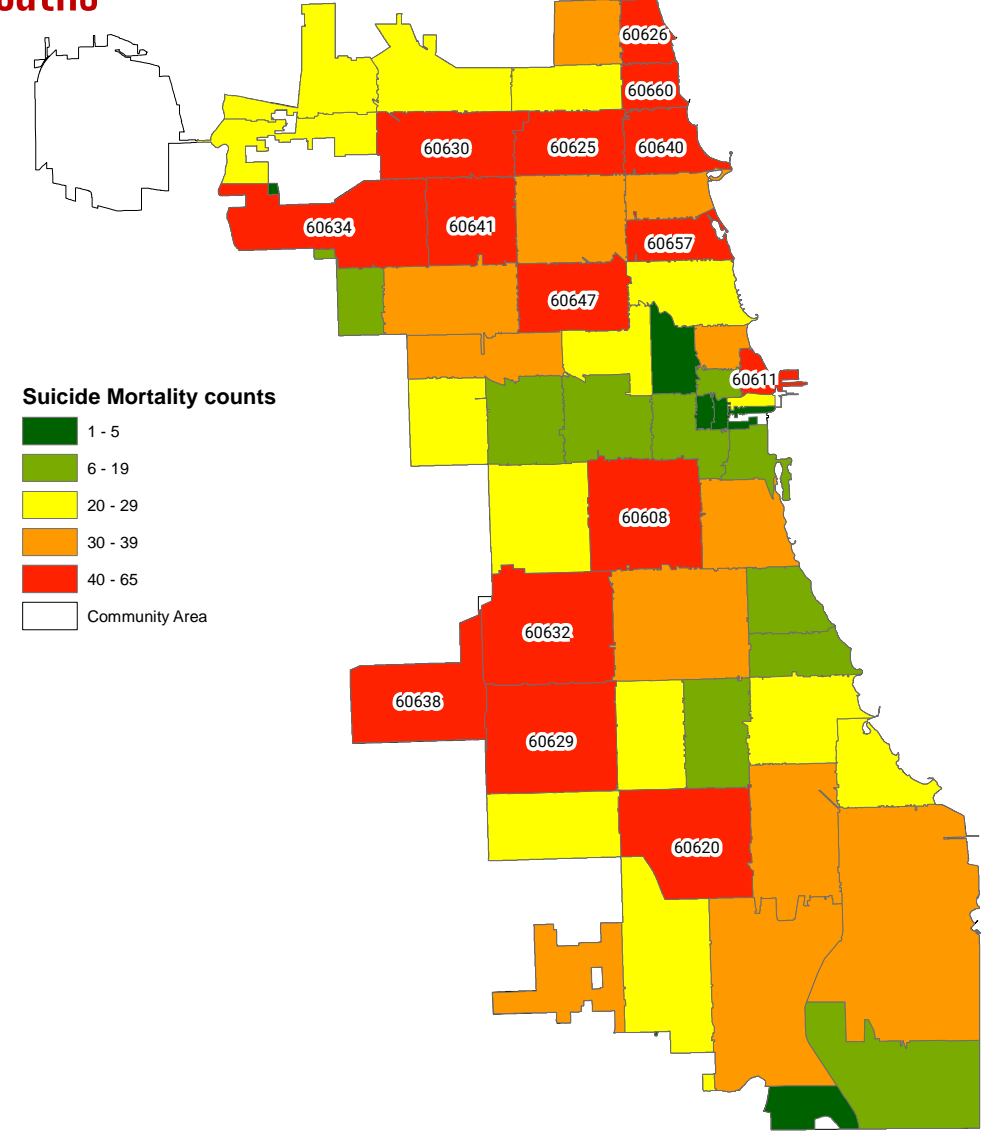
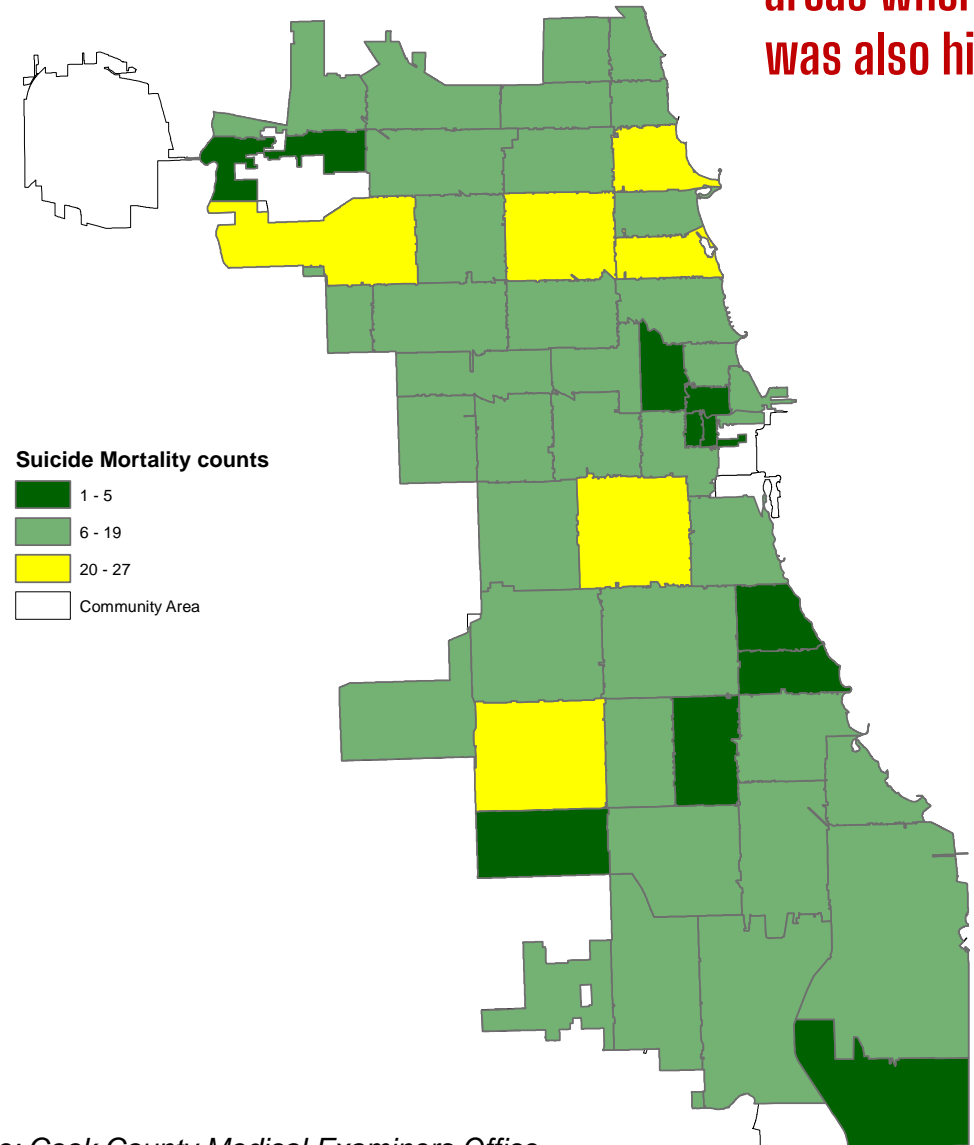
Suicide Mortality among Chicago residents by zip code

Higher suicide mortality in areas where COVID deaths was also high

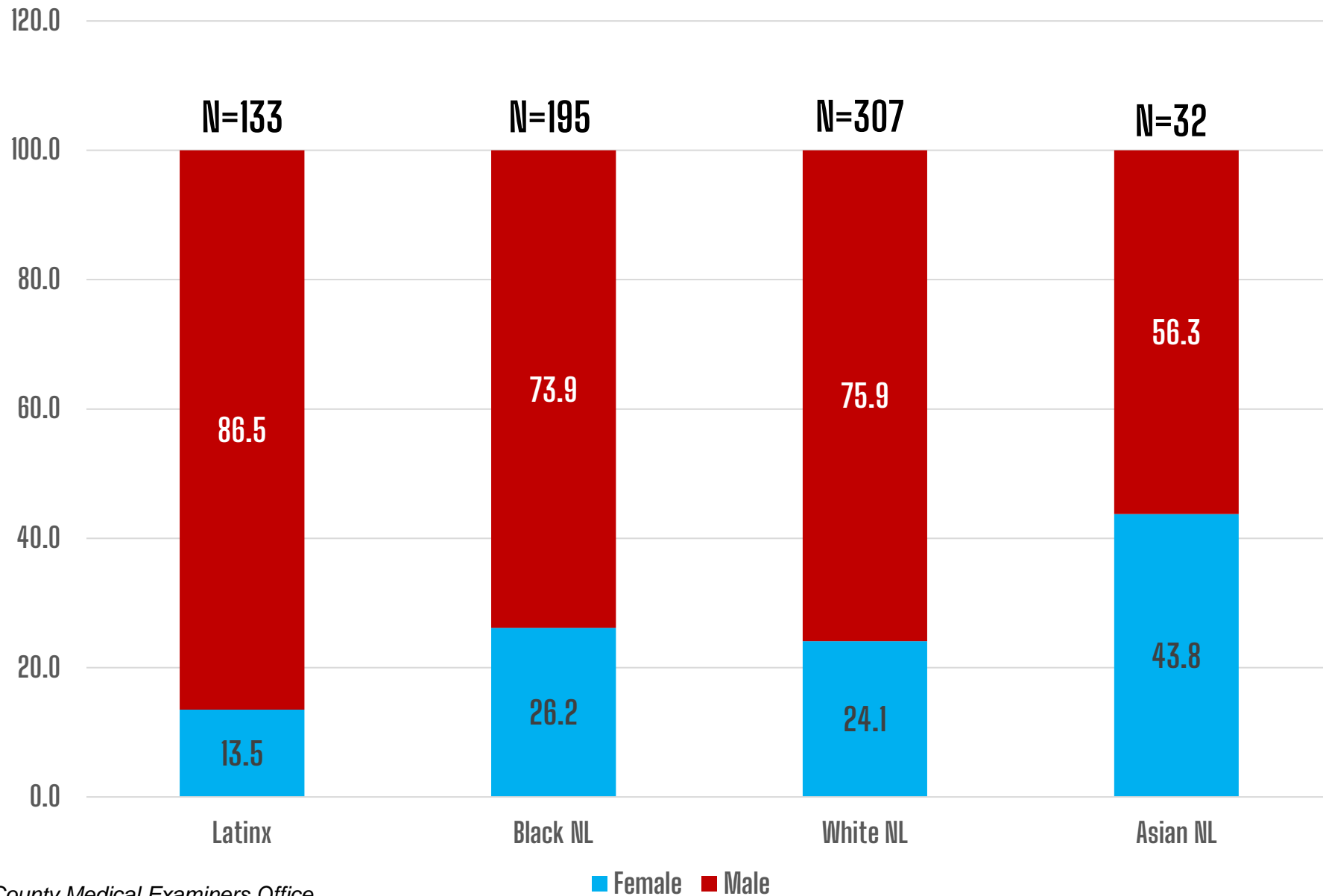
2020-2022 (n=673)

➤ **Suicide mortality is affecting males at much higher rate compared to females in all race/ethnicity groups**

Suicide Mortality by Race/Ethnicity and Gender among Chicago residents, 2020-2022



- Blacks represent almost half of all suicides among Chicago residents less than 25 years of age
- Whites represent 63 percent of all suicides among Chicago residents 65 years and over

Percent of suicide mortality for selected age groups by race/ethnicity, 2020–2022

Under 25 years	24.0	47.1	23.1	5.0	0.8	121
Seniors (65+)	12.4	19.1	62.9	4.8	1.0	101

Changes in suicide mortality among males by race/ethnicity

Race/Ethnicity	2017–2019		2020–2022	Percent Change
Latinx	86	↑	115	33.7%
Black NL	111	↑	144	29.7%
White NL	242	↓	233	-3.7%
Asian NL	23	↓	18	-21.7%
Unknown	3		3	0.0%
Total	465	↑	513	10.3%

- Black males and Latinos have seen significant increases in suicide mortality since 2020 compared to before the COVID pandemic

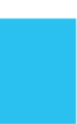
