MINUTES [Draft]

Board Members Present: President Ghian Foreman, Eva-Dina Delgado, Michael Eaddy, Steve Flores, John P. O'Malley Jr., John H. Simpson (via audio conference), Rhoda D. Sweeney, and Andrea L. Zopp.

Board Members Absent: None.

Others Present: Chicago Police Department Chief of Patrol Fred Waller, Assistant General Counsel to the Superintendent Dana O'Malley, Civilian Office of Police Accountability Chief Administrator Sydney Roberts, Police Board Executive Director Max A. Caproni, and members of the public.

President Foreman called the meeting to order. He reported that Board Member Simpson is unable to attend the meeting in person. Board Member Eaddy moved to permit attendance via audio conference. The motion passed by a vote of 7 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

1. Board Member Eaddy moved to approve the minutes of the Board's regular public meeting held on April 19, 2018. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

2. President Foreman announced that the Board's next regular public meeting will be at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, June 14, 2018, at Chicago Public Safety Headquarters.

Board Member Flores moved to close a series of executive sessions of the Board for the purposes of considering litigation and personnel matters, as authorized by sections 2(c)(1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois Open Meetings Act. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

3. President Foreman stated that a report of disciplinary actions taken by the Board during the previous month appears in the blue books made available at the meeting, and he noted that this report and the Board's written findings and decisions are posted on the Board's website. He then announced that the Board considered in a closed meeting several disciplinary cases, and that the Board will now take final action on these cases.

- Case Nos. 16 PB 2923 & 2924. Board Member O'Malley moved to find Sergeant Luis Lopez and Police Officer Daniel Feliciano guilty of making certain false statements related to an unauthorized vehicle pursuit, and to suspend each respondent until January 11, 2020. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor (Foreman, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed. Board Member Zopp moved to adopt the written findings and decision that have been reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 6 in favor (Foreman, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.
- Case No. 17 PB 2933. Board Member Zopp moved to find Police Officers Robert Lobianco and Kevin Fry guilty of writing false reports and falsely testifying at a criminal trial, and to discharge each respondent from the Chicago Police Department. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed. Board Member Eaddy moved to adopt the written findings and decision that have been reviewed by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.
- Case No. 17 PB 2937. President Foreman reported that on March 22, 2018, the Police Board found Police Officer Anthony Wilson not guilty of charges that he resided outside the City of Chicago, and that the Superintendent subsequently filed with the Board a motion to reconsider this decision. Board Member Sweeney moved find that the Board does not have jurisdiction to consider the Superintendent's motion to reconsider. Board Member Sweeney's motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed. Board Member Sweeney moved to adopt the written order that has been agreed to by all Board members who participated in the case. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

President Foreman stated that the decisions in the above cases will be entered as of today's date and will be issued to the parties, and that a copy of the written decisions will be posted on the Board's website as required by the Municipal Code of Chicago.

4. President Foreman announced that copies of the general orders and other directives issued by the Superintendent of Police during the previous month are listed in the blue books made available at the meeting and are posted on the Police Department's website.

5. President Foreman noted that the next item of business is the Superintendent's report. Board Member Flores moved to waive the oral presentation and receive the report in writing. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed.

6. President Foreman called upon those members of the public who had signed up in advance to speak. (*See the transcript of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for a complete report of each speaker's remarks.*)

- Latoya Jones asked about the status of the disciplinary matter involving the fatal shooting of Quintonio LeGrier and Bettie Jones by Police Officer Robert Rialmo. President Foreman responded that a hearing before the Police Board has not yet taken place.
- Crista Noel spoke about the fatal shooting of Quintonio LeGrier and Bettie Jones by Police Officer Robert Rialmo.
- John Catanzara asked questions about the investigation of the above shooting, merit promotions, and Rule 14 violations.
- EvAngel YHWHnewBN spoke about police officers shooting dogs.
- Queen Sister spoke about several issues, including a gun turn-in, complaints about Board members, and a Freedom of Information Act request she submitted.
- Robert More spoke about a variety of matters.
- President Foreman called upon the following individuals and there was no response: Brian Darcy, Darva Watkins, and George Blakemore.

President Foreman stated that all persons who had signed up in advance to speak had been called. Board Member Flores moved to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed by a vote of 8 in favor (Foreman, Delgado, Eaddy, Flores, O'Malley, Simpson, Sweeney, and Zopp) to 0 opposed, and President Foreman announced that the meeting is adjourned.

**Policy Regarding the Attendance of and Participation by
the Public at Board Meetings**

(Adopted 15 December 2005)

The Police Board values the attendance of the public at its meetings and the opportunity to receive comments and questions on matters concerning the Board or the Police Department. The Board will treat members of the public with courtesy and respect, and expects that the public will treat Board members and Department members in a similar manner.

Toward that end, the Board has adopted the following rules governing conduct at Board meetings:

1. An individual wishing to address the Board must sign-up in advance by contacting the Board's office by phone, fax, or in person no later than 4:30 p.m. of the day before the meeting.
2. When called upon to address the Board, each speaker is to identify him/herself and speak clearly so that all in attendance may hear and so that the court reporter may make an accurate record of the proceedings.
3. Due to time constraints, each speaker is limited to two minutes and must conclude when asked to do so by the Board member acting as parliamentarian.
4. Personal attacks, obscene language, fighting words, threats, conduct intended to disrupt or interfere with the meeting, and comments not related to matters within the Board's or the Department's jurisdiction, by a speaker or any person in attendance, are strictly prohibited.

Violation of any of the above rules may result in the removal of the violator from the meeting room, or in the immediate adjournment of the meeting; in addition, repeated violations may result in the violator not being permitted to attend or participate in future Board meetings.

PERSONNEL AND TRAINING

During the month of **May 2018**, **136** training blocks were conducted for Chicago Police Recruits, Metropolitan Recruits (including surrounding agencies) and In-Service Courses.

A total of **27,527** Department attendees received In-Service/E-Learning training, which included: Active Shooter, LEMART In-Service and Refresher CPR, Prescribed Weapons Qualifications, Procedural Justice and Legitimacy 1 and 2, Roll Call Presentation: Bean Bag Shotgun Awareness, POWER Test, Patrol Carbine Requalification A, Force Mitigation, DUI Paperwork for Police Officers and Supervisors, PAPV Training, TASER Repairs and Command Staff ASI Workshop CPD/CFD.

A total of **836 Chicago Police Recruits** were in training along with **47 Metropolitan Police Recruits**.
