REPORT OF COMMUNITY INPUT RECEIVED
AT THE PUBLIC MEETING ON APRIL 21, 2022
Date of Report: May 26, 2022

Eleven members of the public spoke during the public comments portion of the meeting. See the transcript and the video recording of the meeting, posted on the Board's website, for the complete remarks of each speaker.

The Chicago Police Department responded to the remarks by Eunice Chatman and by the members of the public who spoke about Together We Can, a community- and CPD-led project in the 3rd and 6th police districts (see below). The Office of the Police Board responded to Pebbles Prince by providing information on how to file a complaint of alleged police misconduct. The Office of the Police Board determined that the remarks made by the remaining speakers did not require a response in addition to that provided at the meeting.

Chicago Police Department's Response to Community Input at the 21 April 2022 Police Board Meeting

- 006th District Commander Senora Ben worked with BACP regarding the Family Fresh store and it was temporarily closed. Commander Ben also ran calls for service from 01 Jan to 24 May and learned of three calls for service in that time period.
The 006th District will continue to monitor the location and take appropriate actions to address any observable issues to ensure the citizens of the Gresham community can enjoy their neighborhood.
- Deputy Chief Migdalia Bulnes of the Recruitment and Retention Unit continues to build the mutually beneficial relationship with Together We Can and Ms. Edwards. Together We Can had a successful recruiting event on 05 May at the Culver's located at 3355 S. King Drive. Another recruiting event with Together We Can is scheduled for 17 June at 11050 S. Doty Avenue.
