

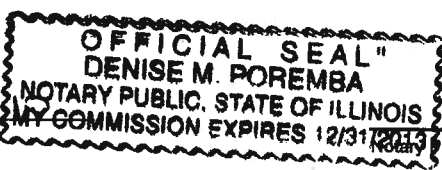

1. Please describe the major features of this project.

To conduct contaminated soil remediation to a maximum depth of six (6) feet and placemtn of clean fill material in order to obtain a comprehensive No Further Remediation letter from the Illinisi Environmental Protection Agency.

2. Please explain why this project could not be bid using the city's traditional bid process and the need to use JOC Procurement system.

The Scope of Work and size of the project fits inside the initial design of the DOE JOC program. Furthermore, the City has the intent of turning the property into a park.
