## CLASSICS IN THE PARKS SERIES EXTENDS CHICAGO OPERA THEATER'S ACCLAIMED PRODUCTION OF ORPHEUS & EURIDICE

Three Additional Performances to Be Held in Welles Park

Following a successful run at Eckhart Park in which every seat was filled, Mayor Rahm Emanuel and the Chicago Park District in collaboration with the Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs and Special Events today announce an extension of Chicago Opera Theater's production of Ricky Ian Gordon's *Orpheus & Euridice*. The production is part of the Classics in the Parks series.

"As part of the Chicago Cultural Plan, we are working to ensure that all Chicagoans have access to a variety of arts experiences that will enrich lives and foster cultural growth," said Mayor Emanuel. "After attending one of the November performances, I know firsthand that *Orpheus & Euridice* is a production that should not be missed."

The original cast, featuring former Chicago Opera Theater Young Artist Valerie Vinzant as Euridice and acclaimed clarinetist Todd Palmer, return for the extension. The extension is being underwritten by the Park District.

"The Classics in the Parks series is another example of how we are bringing professional arts presentations into the neighborhoods free of charge," said Chicago Park District General Superintendent and CEO Michael Kelly.

Three additional performances will run on December 19, 20 and 22 at the pool in Welles Park, located at 2333 W. Sunnyside Ave. All three performances begin at 7:30 p.m. Admission is free and tickets can be reserved in advance at <u>www.chicagooperatheater.org</u> or by calling 312-704-8414. Limited walk-up tickets become available on a first come, first served basis at the park at 5 p.m. each performance day.

This modern retelling of the famous Greek myth is directed and designed by Chicago Opera Theater General Director Andreas Mitisek, conducted by Stephen Hargreaves at the piano, with lighting design by David Lee Bradke.
