The Board has reviewed your case and has concluded that given the information you supplied, your position as Treasurer of your family firm, [Redacted], does not present a conflict of interest with your current position as a City of Chicago police officer.

According to the Executive Order 86-1, any employee of the City is prohibited from having a financial interest in a city contract. As you do not have such an interest in your family's firm and are not a paid employee, there is nothing to prevent your family's firm, [Redacted] from obtaining a city contract, insofar as the Executive Order is concerned. We must add, however, that should you obtain a financial interest in this firm or receive income from it, you should report this to the Board of Ethics immediately, for it may be a violation of the Executive Order.
