1 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Good evening. My name is Lori  
2 Lightfoot and I'm the president of the Chicago  
3 Police Board. I'm calling this meeting to order.  
4 The first item of business is approval of the  
5 minutes of the Board's public meeting of  
6 February 18, 2016. Is there a motion to approve the  
7 minutes?

8 MS. BALLATE: So moved.

9 MR. FOREMAN: Second.

10 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor?  
11 (chorus of ayes.) Any opposed? The motion passes.

12 Our next public meeting will be on  
13 Thursday, April 21st at 7:30 p.m. here at the  
14 Chicago Public Safety Headquarters. At this time I  
15 ask for a motion to close a series of executive  
16 sessions for the purposes of considering personnel  
17 matters and litigation as authorized by  
18 Section 2(C) (1), (3), (4), and (11) of the Illinois  
19 Open Meetings Act. Is there such a motion?

20 MS. FRY: So moved.

21 MR. FOREMAN: Second.

22 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Chorus of  
23 ayes.) The motion passes. A report of disciplinary  
24 action taken by the Board during the previous month

1 has been made available at this evening's meeting.  
2 This report and the Board's written Findings and  
3 Decisions are posted on the Board's website. The  
4 Police Board, as authorized by the Open Meetings  
5 Act, has considered in a closed meeting several  
6 disciplinary cases. The Board now will take final  
7 action on these cases.

8           Regarding case number 15 PB 2889, is  
9 there a motion to find Police Officer Vincent Foggey  
10 guilty of failing in his duty to assist his partner  
11 in putting a resistant assailant into custody, and  
12 to discharge Officer Foggey from the Chicago Police  
13 Department?

14           MS. BALLATE: So moved.

15           MR. FOREMAN: Second.

16           MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Show of  
17 hands.) Any opposed? Voting in favor are Board  
18 members Foreman, Ballate, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry,  
19 Simpson, Sweeney, Valenzuela and myself. Motion  
20 passes.

21           Is there a motion to adopt the written  
22 findings and decision that has been reviewed by all  
23 Board members who participated in the case?

24           MR. FOREMAN: So moved.

1 MR. EADDY: Second.

2 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Chorus of  
3 ayes.) Any opposed? Motion passes.

4 Regarding case number 16 PB 2900, the  
5 Superintendent filed charges to discharge Lieutenant  
6 Denis Walsh from the Chicago Police Department for  
7 misconduct related to the Koschman homicide  
8 investigation. The superintendent subsequently  
9 moved to withdraw the charges without prejudice  
10 because the Respondent, Lieutenant Denis Walsh,  
11 resigned from the Chicago Police Department. Is  
12 there a motion to grant the Superintendent's motion  
13 to withdraw the charges?

14 MS. FRY: So moved.

15 MR. FOREMAN: Second.

16 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Show of  
17 hands.) Any opposed? Voting in favor are Board  
18 members Foreman, Ballate, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry,  
19 Simpson, Sweeney, Valenzuela, and myself. Motion  
20 passes.

21 Regarding case number 16 PB 2902, the  
22 Superintendent filed charges to discharge Sergeant  
23 James Eldridge from the Chicago Police Department  
24 for receiving bribes. The Superintendent

1 subsequently moved to withdraw the charges without  
2 prejudice because the Respondent resigned from the  
3 CPD. Is there a motion to grant the  
4 Superintendent's motion to withdraw the charges  
5 without prejudice?

6 MR. FOREMAN: So moved.

7 MR. EADDY: Second.

8 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Chorus of  
9 ayes). Any opposed? Voting in favor are Board  
10 members Foreman, Ballate, Conlon, Eaddy, Fry,  
11 Simpson, Sweeney, Valenzuela and myself. Motion  
12 passes.

13 The Board's decisions in all cases in  
14 which we took final action this evening will be  
15 entered as of today's date and will be issued to the  
16 parties. A copy of the written decisions will be  
17 posted on the Board's website within ten days  
18 pursuant to the Chicago Municipal Code.

19 General orders and other directives  
20 issued by the Superintendent of Police during the  
21 previous month are listed in the blue books and are  
22 available on the Police Department's website.

23 Next item is Superintendent's report to  
24 the Board. Is there a motion to waive the oral

1 presentation and receive the monthly report in  
2 writing?

3 MS. FRY: So moved.

4 MR. EADDY: Second.

5 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Chorus of  
6 ayes.) Any opposed? Motion passes.

7 Before proceeding to the public comment  
8 portion of the meeting, I would like to update you  
9 on the following Board member matters. As you may  
10 have heard this morning in a public meeting, the  
11 Board took final action on three finalists for the  
12 Superintendent, which nominations have now been  
13 formally tendered to the Mayor. Information about  
14 the three finalists is available tonight at the side  
15 table over here on my right, and has information  
16 about the finalists if you're interested in  
17 receiving that information.

18 In addition, as many of you know, the  
19 Superintendent filed with the Police Board in late  
20 2015 charges against Detective Dante Servin relating  
21 to the fatal shooting of Rekia Boyd, and recommended  
22 that he be discharged from the Chicago Police  
23 Department. The Police Board's responsibility is to  
24 decide the case based on the evidence presented at

1 the evidentiary hearing. The hearing has been set  
2 and is scheduled to begin on May 19th and will be  
3 open to the public. Detailed information on the  
4 Board's process for deciding on disciplinary cases  
5 including the Servin case is on our website.

6 I will now call upon those members of the  
7 public who signed up in advance to speak. When your  
8 name is called, please step forward to the  
9 microphone, and again, we will ask that you limit  
10 your comments to two minutes. First is Dorothy  
11 Holmes.

12 MS. HOLMES: Good evening. I'm the mother of  
13 Ronald Johnson, who was murdered by Detective George  
14 Hernandez who still has a job. And I know when we  
15 come in here, ya'll care less what we talking about.  
16 But we getting tired because we aren't getting what  
17 we want, and when we react, ya'll call out your dog  
18 men, I guess to attack, but all you all that's  
19 sitting there up with your suits and ties and all  
20 that on, and your dresses, ya'll just as guilty as  
21 those police officers that pulled the trigger, took  
22 our kids away from us. The police officers that  
23 life been taken already, they have a memorial wall  
24 with their names in there. Why can't we have the



1 same for our kids that's being murdered? Why can't  
2 we get a room in this building with our kids  
3 pictures hanging in there showing that they life was  
4 taken also by CPD, the ones that ya'll is hiding  
5 behind -- that's hiding behind you all and you're  
6 taking up for them. We never get no response back  
7 from you. You still there and look at us as if  
8 we're crazy as hell. No, we aren't crazy, we just  
9 tired as hell about not getting no response back  
10 from you. And with that being said, just like Anita  
11 Alvarez out of there, all you need to go too.

12 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Panzy Edwards.

13 MS. EDWARDS: Yeah. I just wanted to say when  
14 ya'll closed this meeting down the last time, I  
15 don't know how you all feel when ya'll go home and  
16 go to sleep at night. It's people in here who lost  
17 family. Ya'll didn't have no remorse. It was just  
18 like forget what everybody else was saying. Ya'll  
19 didn't want to hear it no more because the people in  
20 here are infuriated because they're losing their  
21 family members. People got to go home at night.  
22 After people left here, they -- how do you think  
23 they felt when they left here to go home and mourn  
24 because the people who have our lives in their hands

1 sit here and be like officer just killed your son or  
2 officer just killed your brother, or officer just  
3 killed your nephew or officer just killed this.  
4 Ya'll sit here and look at people like, oh well,  
5 it's not our fault. But everybody who lose family  
6 members, ya'll could be like okay, well this officer  
7 -- because it ain't no question what's right or  
8 wrong. You know every single person who been  
9 murdered ain't got a gun. Everybody ain't got one.  
10 Even if they did, ya'll teach them tactics to shoot  
11 without killing. You know what I mean.

12 The child was 15 years old. He never had  
13 a chance to graduate high school, never had a chance  
14 to have kids, never had a chance to see his nieces  
15 his nephews, no nothing. Ya'll sit back here like  
16 all this is okay that these police is -- not only  
17 that, you are -- ya'll act like people have guns.  
18 Somebody speak about their family members, knowing  
19 you leave or go to eat steak and potatoes and go  
20 home and go to sleep, take a nap, go wake up in the  
21 morning because your family is not being murdered.

22 You and these people right behind, they  
23 got their hand on their gun. They're ready to shoot  
24 up in here but ya'll going to be safe. You got this

1 line here. You leave out of here for the night.  
2 When we leave out here or even when in here, we're  
3 identified. We are criminals. You just judge us  
4 because our families been killed. Ya'll, if it was  
5 up to us, you think we wouldn't fire him? If we had  
6 that right, you think people wouldn't be held  
7 accountable for killing innocent people? Ya'll are  
8 sitting here looking at people. You don't care what  
9 I'm saying.

10 Dakota Bright was 15 years old. He was a  
11 kid. He deserved to live. He deserved for his  
12 mother to be able to say oh my son did this or my  
13 son did that. She don't have that opportunity.  
14 Nobody in his family has that opportunity, but that  
15 don't bother ya'll. Ya'll still going to be like  
16 I'm so tired of hearing these people. April 21st,  
17 you will still be tired of hearing people talk.  
18 Probably the -- tomorrow it will be new people from  
19 them losing their family members. These police is  
20 killing us every day.

21 We don't even have a chance. We have no  
22 chance out here in the world, but that don't bother  
23 you because ya'll safe. Everybody else ain't safe  
24 but ya'll are.

1 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Thank you ma'am.

2 MS. EDWARDS: Yes I know.

3 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Curly Cowen.

4 MR. COWEN: We are here to call to order a  
5 people to -- a people's assembly. We know that this  
6 Board does not care about Black women and does not  
7 care about Black girls. They don't care about Black  
8 people. We know that they care about protecting the  
9 police, corporate lawyers cronies, only care about  
10 making them happy and making Rahm look good.

11 Meanwhile Dante Servin walks free. Meanwhile Robert  
12 Reyano walks free. George Hernandez walks free.  
13 The officer who killed Dakota Bright walks free.

14 We demand that they are fired. We demand  
15 that the City stop over funding the police  
16 department and start funding more public services  
17 like our neighborhoods, our public schools, our  
18 mental health facilities, schools. Our schools have  
19 libraries with no teachers. Our schools have more  
20 police but no actual librarian to educate them, no  
21 counselors, no social workers but metal detectors.  
22 We have no way to deal with counseling with children  
23 and families dealing with trauma by CPD. We are  
24 tired and we will be here til this bitch burns down.

1           We demand that there is a creation of an  
2 independent, publicly elected police accountability  
3 council. We want to know what you want. The  
4 Chicago Police Board's job is to decide disciplinary  
5 cases involving policemen's misconduct. But they  
6 have procrastinated making a decision on the firing  
7 of Dante Servin, all these killer cops. They have  
8 disregarded, disrespected the families of police  
9 violence. That ain't right. Over 4700 people have  
10 signed a petition in support of firing Dante Servin.  
11 Chicago and the people all over the country want to  
12 see justice for Rekia Boyd, justice for Rekia Boyd.

13           CPD has spent more than 500 million  
14 dollars on the past ten years in settlements for  
15 police misconduct. No killing. Rahm Emmanuel has  
16 led the passing of a budget that gives 200 million  
17 dollars to policing. Meanwhile unemployment among  
18 Blacks is higher in Chicago than it is nationally.  
19 That ain't right. This Board --

20           MS. LIGHTFOOT: Next speaker.

21           MS. COWEN: In the city --

22           MS. LIGHTFOOT: -- is Christa Noel.

23           MS. COWEN: -- need to get their shit  
24 together.

1 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Next speaker is George  
2 Blakemore.

3 THE CROWD: Force them out. Ask Gary --

4 MR. BLAKEMORE: I will not be able to go  
5 ahead.

6 THE CROWD: -- doesn't care about Black people  
7 in Chicago. Lori Lightfoot doesn't care about Black  
8 people in Chicago.

9 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Go ahead Mr. Blakemore.

10 MR. BLAKEMORE: I can't speak over this. Sit  
11 them down.

12 MS. LIGHTFOOT: I'm going to ask the group,  
13 you're -- I'll ask you to respect the rights of  
14 other people to speak.

15 THE CROWD: We kept showing up. They put a  
16 time check on the ability to speak at the mike.

17 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Officers.

18 THE CROWD: They continued to interrupt Ms.  
19 Panzy when she speaks.

20 MS. LIGHTFOOT: I'll ask you for the last time  
21 to allow these people to sign up to speak. After  
22 that, we will clear the room by CPD. Officers,  
23 please clear the room.

24 THE CROWD: Not today.

1 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Mr. Blakemore, please proceed.  
2 Everybody has to have the opportunity to speak. I  
3 don't want to have the officers to have you clear  
4 the room. If you please do not allow other people  
5 to speak, we will have to clear the room.

6 MR. FOREMAN: Mr. Blakemore, please proceed.

7 MR. FOREMAN: Thank you very much sir, and I  
8 am glad to be here. To Madam Lightfoot and the  
9 members of the Board, I came with my own issues. I  
10 have been denied the right to speak because you had  
11 other speakers that did not respect this process.

12 MR. FOREMAN: Continue Mr. Blakemore.

13 MR. BLAKEMORE: I can be seated and later on  
14 you can call me. Will you do that?

15 MR. FOREMAN: Absolutely. Ms. Eveangel  
16 Yhwnewbn.

17 MS. YHWNEWBN: Last month the City paid out  
18 5.5 million dollars to John Burge torture victims  
19 torturing people -- Black men in holding cells.  
20 They also paid out five million dollars in hush  
21 money to hush up the police murder of LaQuan  
22 McDonald. I'm here to follow up on the police  
23 misconduct that still goes on with their unlawful  
24 stops and seizures that went on last month. I told

1 you what had happened in an unlawful stop that I  
2 endured. Now, Lisa Madigan's office said that the  
3 police had seven business days to give a factual,  
4 detailed, and legal reason why I couldn't get the  
5 dash cam that the police officer said that he was  
6 using. Instead, the police office sent them a  
7 letter saying that they did not get the revised  
8 copy. Now, they have the original copy. They gave  
9 me a copy and the date stamp, but yet they claim  
10 they didn't get anything.

11 My court date was on August -- on May  
12 11th. So May 9th is when they were supposed to have  
13 the legal, factual information. Instead they played  
14 this game. They stop you. They harass you, stress  
15 you out, and then they don't show up in court, and  
16 then the judge starts to do you a favor. He decided  
17 to do you a favor and forgive the ticket that you  
18 should not have got in the first place and you have  
19 got no justice.

20 So I asked for a continuance. I have a  
21 trial coming up. I want to know why that police  
22 officer wasn't there. Why I received another letter  
23 saying that now there was no dash cam. Either FOP  
24 is lying or the police officer is lying that stopped



1 me and said I was being videotaped is lying. But  
2 either way, it goes -- somebody is committing  
3 perjury, and it's your job to figure out who those  
4 people are. And I want you to do your job.

5 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Next speaker is Christa Noel.  
6 (Not speaking.) Next speaker is Robert Moore.

7 MR. MORE: It is the 17th of March, 2016,  
8 St. Patrick's Day on the liturgical calendar. I  
9 would like to express empathy for the members of non  
10 governmental entities, which is all -- the root core  
11 of the problem is that -- it's unnecessary to  
12 identify the cause, it's Jewish supremacist, and the  
13 fact that the vast majority of the people are  
14 considered to be human beings. That's the ultimate

15 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Mr. More.

16 MR. MORE: Okay, let me move on here. So this  
17 non government entity, the whole situation is so far  
18 away from what the Magna Carta and every legitimate  
19 branch of the Magna Carta, which is 1215 AD 615 --  
20 1215 AD, that's the core problem. And I move on  
21 here because while I empathize with the victims, I  
22 also have to condemn any type of activity, any use  
23 of language incompatible with the Tenth Commandment  
24 to protect my own claim to eventual deliverance from

1 all evil which is my agenda.

2 I also recognize that my -- and express  
3 and support for Mr. Moran. That may raise questions  
4 in peoples minds as to what my actual agenda is, my  
5 position, and I have to be vetted like everyone else  
6 continually. If anyone seeks information in that  
7 regard, I will be happy to provide that within the  
8 next year. Ms. Lightfoot, you received a number of  
9 questions from me through the sergeant at arms in  
10 the last meeting. Could you provide me some  
11 explanation to the public as to what the answers to  
12 those questions are, and/or what your position is in  
13 regards to the availability of the chief policy  
14 maker under Monell versus Department of Social  
15 Services of the city of New York, which is the  
16 person who was in the superintendent's seat.  
17 Accessibility so that the public can prove Monell  
18 claims and also prove in a given instance violations  
19 of 18 USC 24-1 which I'm sure you're familiar with,  
20 is specific intent crimes.

21 So it's necessary to prove the state of  
22 mind of the Superintendent and any other individuals  
23 who are responsible to the public interest, to get  
24 legitimate prosecution and convictions for

1 violations of 18 U.S. 242. So my -- is there going  
2 to be answers to those questions? Is that going to  
3 be provided? And the other question is, in what  
4 theater is your understanding and what authority  
5 would you site in which the city of Chicago is  
6 making a chief policy maker available to members of  
7 the public in regards to constitutional deprivation?  
8 Because juries are being led to believe --

9 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Mr. More, your time is up.

10 MR. MORE: Am I going to get any answers to  
11 the questions?

12 MS. LIGHTFOOT: I'm not familiar with the  
13 specific questions.

14 MR. MORE: I gave to the sergeant at arms last  
15 week.

16 MS. LIGHTFOOT: I'll look into it further.  
17 Next speaker is Mr. John Catanzara.

18 MR. CATANZARA: Are you aware there is an FBI  
19 investigation on IPRA?

20 MS. LIGHTFOOT: We heard you.

21 MR. CATANZARA: Did you know?

22 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Is there something more you  
23 wanted to say?

24 MR. CATANZARA: Ms. Fairly, are you aware of

1 the FBI agents --

2 (Crowd continues to chant.)

3 MS. LIGHTFOOT: Is there a motion to adjourn  
4 the meeting? Move to adjourn the meeting.

5 MS. FRY: So moved.

6 MR. EADDY: Second.

7 MS. LIGHTFOOT: All in favor? (Chorus of  
8 ayes.) Any opposed? Meeting is adjourned.

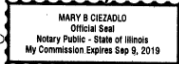
