

Please explain why this project could not be bid using the city's traditional bid process and the need to use JOC Procurement system.

The HVAC package (Airhandlers, Chiller, cooling tower, boilers,) is being traditional bid. The Building Automation System (controls) needs to be done thru JOC due to DGS wanting an open protocal system. Even though an open protocal system could possible be achieved thru Traditional Bid to ensure that we are installing a system that is exactly the same as the existing. In traditional bid, specing open protocal could mean several things - open proptocal can be Lonwork, Backnet, or Modbus and then converted into our Building Automation System with graphics using HTML. Using traditional bid may cause change orders to achieve the same front end that we are currently using. This is a multi phase / multi year job and we need a system that can be added to by any manufactorer. The HVAC equipment has and will continue to be Traditional Bid but DGS feels that using the JOC gives us the most controls over the graphics, communication and any changes that may come up.

The HVAC package (Airhandlers, Chiller, cooling tower, boilers,) is being traditional bid so we are not requesting that JOC do everything. However, we believe it is in the best interest of the City to procure the Building Automation System through JOC for the following reason:

The City would like to maintain an open protocol system at the Pershing Facility. Though an open protocol system could possibly be achieved through traditional bid, there are some risks that the final product will not be what we desire.

The project at 1869 W Pershing is being phased and those phases are being procured through a combination of traditional bidding and Job Order Contracting. If we were to traditionally bid each phase and not use JOC for anything, the Building Automation System will be divided into each phase's bid package. It is likely the traditional bid phases will result in different Contractors. Therefore, each Contractor will be using their own automation system (control) subcontractor. By having different subcontractors perform the work on the controls, we risk not having an open protocol system. Furthermore, each subcontractor has their own way of installing the controls and future maintenance could be difficult and costly. The location of the filters could be slightly different for each subcontractor and in future years, the DGS trades will have a system where each piece of equipment has the filter in a different location. This is only one such example.

Furthermore, the controls are difficult to procure through traditional bidding because it is a difficult system to develop detailed specifications. When installing the controls, the specifications are supplemented with a verbal discussion between the City's Project Manager, Engineers and the Subcontractor performing the work. The only time we will be able to discuss the scope of work with the Subcontractor is after the award has been made. Once we introduce verbal clarifications of the specifications after award, the City may incur a large number of Change Orders, which would increase the cost of the overall project.

Using Job Order Contracting for the Controls will allow the City to get exactly what it wants, minimize costly change orders and guarantee that the system installed will be easier to maintain in the future. DGS is using traditional bid for the HVAC equipment purchase and installation, we are requesting the controls be procured through JOC as it represents the best value for the city: cost, installation and maintenance.

In regards to the disbursement of funds and monitoring invoices, the JOC contractor will be paid according to the percentage complete as applied to the schedule of values detailing each task required to complete the scope of work.
