

### Summary


- This report depicts the period of March 1st through August 30th, 2020 and the comparison to the same period in 2019, to examine trends during the six months that overlap with COVID-19 impact.
- From March 1st through August 30th, 2020, 646 young people were processed at JISC, which is 58% fewer than during the same period in 2019.
  - 78 young people were referred to SGA case management and 90 were released to adult.
- Motor vehicle theft (157) and Drug abuse violations (98) were the most frequent JISC-processed arrest charges from March through August 2020.
- There were decreases in the proportion of youth released to adult (14% of all instances or 90 cases in 2020 and 25% of instances in 2019) and youth referred to SGA case management (12% of instances or 78 cases in 2020 and 14% of instance or 215 cases in 2019).
- The community areas with the most JISC processed arrests were Austin, Humboldt Park, Loop, and West Garfield Park (all with more than 50 youth).
- 36% of young people had no prior arrest in 2020 and 2019). For the year following their JISC-processed arrest 509 youth (or 33%) were not re-arrested in the following year.
- In this 2020 period, youth most commonly arrived at JISC between 2pm and 12am as compared to 11am – 11pm in 2019. Additionally, JISC arrivals were fairly steady throughout the week with a slight decrease on the weekends.
- Across the city for all JISC districts during both the 2019 and 2020 periods, most youth were in transit (between arrest and arrival at JISC) for 30-89 minutes.
- Alternate dispositions (referred to as "overrides" in the OIG report) are not consistently collected by CPD at this time. CPD is updating data collection methods to improve quality and specifically ensure alternate dispositions, approval, and the explanations are documented before 2021.

# 1. Demographic Characteristics

In this period during 2020, the majority of those who have interacted with JISC are Black, male, or 16-17 years old.





# 2. Arrest Breakdown

Motor vehicle theft (157) and Drug abuse violations (98) were the most frequent JISC-processed arrest charges from March through August 2020.

#### 3. Disposition Data by district and community area

Of the most common disposition outcomes in this 2020 period, the most prominent were court referrals (33% or 214 referrals) and detained (22% or 140 cases). Meanwhile, there were decreases in the proportion of youth released to adult (14% of all instances or 90 cases in 2020 and 25% of instances in 2019) and youth referred to SGA case management (12% of instances or 78 cases in 2020 and 14% of instance or 215 cases in 2019).

From March 1<sup>st</sup> – August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the 11<sup>th</sup> and 1<sup>st</sup> districts were the most common arrest location for youth processed at JISC. While during the same period in 2019, the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> districts were most common. All districts experienced a decrease as compared to 2019 and the 10<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> districts saw the most significant decrease in location of youth arrests who result in being processed at JISC, with approximately 74% reductions.

From March 1<sup>st</sup> – August 30<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the Austin, Humboldt Park, Loop, West Garfield Park, community areas were the most common arrest location for youth processed at JISC (all with more than 50 youth). While during the same period in 2019, Austin, Humboldt Park, Loop, North Lawndale, South Lawndale and West Garfield Park were most common. Community areas that saw an increase in JISC-processed arrests from this period in 2020 to 2019 are Armour Square (14% increase) and Kenwood (100% increase) while West Town (94% decrease) and Woodlawn (85% decrease) have seen the most significant decrease.





### 4. Re-arrest Rates<sup>2</sup>

This period in 2019 and 2020 saw similar trends of most youth having few prior arrests (36% of young people had no prior arrest in 2020 and 2019). For the year following their JISC-processed arrest 509 youth (or 33%) were not re-arrested in the following year.









# 5. JISC Arrival Date and Time<sup>3</sup> By District

Across all participating JISC districts in this 2020 period, youth most commonly arrived at JISC between 2pm and 12am as compared to 11am – 11pm in 2019. Additionally, JISC arrivals were fairly steady throughout the week with a slight decrease on weekends during this period in 2019. In 2020, the trend was fairly steady although Saturday was the least frequent day of the week.
















Arrival Date - District 10 MON TUE WED THU FRI SAT SUN Arrival Date






Arrival Date - District 15 MON TUE WED THU FRI SAT SUN Arrival Date



# 6. Movement Time<sup>4,5</sup> By District

While a youth's movement time before arriving at JISC is the responsibility of CPD patrol officers in each district, this analysis provides context for potential broader changes with youth interactions across CPD. Across the city for all JISC districts during both the 2019 and 2020 periods, most youth were in transit (between arrest and arrival at JISC) for 30-89 minutes.
