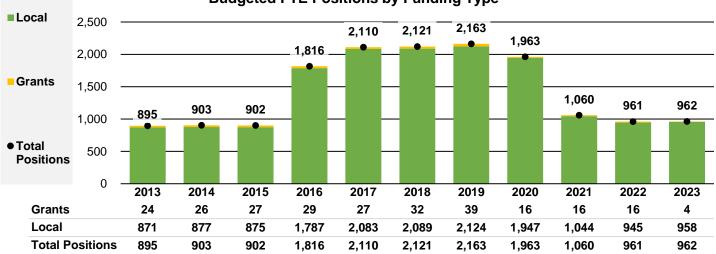

- The 2023 Budget Recommendation appropriates \$109.1 million to OEMC, which is a decrease of \$9.41 million, or (7.9%), from FY22.
- The appropriation categories driving the FY23 decrease are Personnel and Equipment, which are decreasing by \$3.39 million and \$6.29 million, respectively, from FY22's revised budget.
  - **Personnel** A significant driver behind OEMC's Personnel 0 decrease in FY23 looks to be a \$3.5M grant ending (Urban Areas Security Initiative), which supported salaries & fringe.
  - Equipment Similar to Personnel, the area of Equipment is seeing a major decline due to the \$6.29M Urban Areas Security Initiative grant ending, which supported Machinery & Equipment in FY22.
- OEMC receives most of its funding from Local funds—71.3%—in FY23, and of that the Emergency Comm Fund accounts for 55.4%.
- The proposed FY23 Budget appropriates 962 positions to OEMC, which is 1 position more than FY22.
- OEMC's vacancy rate is estimated to be 11.2% as of Oct 2022.

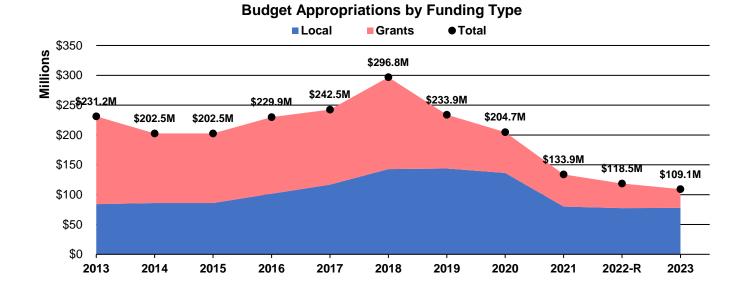
### What's New?

- **+\$300K** New Grant for *Port Security* in FY23
- +\$8.56K New funding for Reimbursement to Travelers
- New Personnel Title
  - Police Communications Operator-Trainer 25 Positions; \$1.6M in salary. The 25 positions being added to this new Title in FY23 are essentially being shifted over from the existing Title named Police Communications Operator II.
