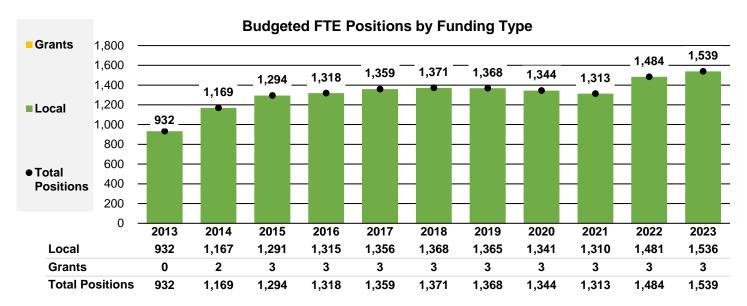

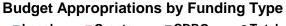
- ➤ The 2023 Budget Recommendation appropriates \$1,399.3 million to CDOT, which is an increase of \$776.9 million, or 124.8%, from FY22's revised budget.
- ➤ The appropriation category driving the FY23 increase is **Permanent Improvements**, which is increasing by \$882.7 million, or 302.3%, from FY22. Below is a snapshot of the largest changes:

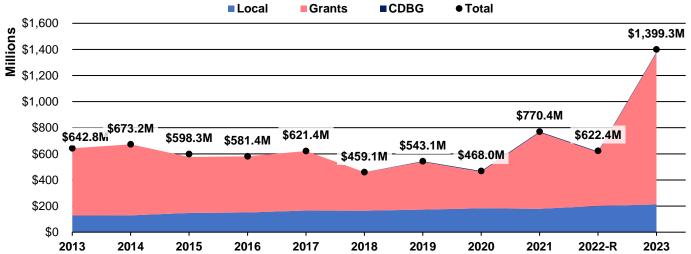

- ➤ The proposed FY23 Budget appropriates **1,539 Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs)** to CDOT, which is an increase of 55 FTEs compared to FY22.
- ➤ As of Oct 2022, CDOT has 1,222 active employees, and COFA estimates CDOT's vacancy rate to be 17.7%.
- ➤ 84.4% of CDOT's funding in FY23 comes from **Grants**.
