# Health



### About YRBS

YRBS is our only representative data source on LGBTQ+ demographics, mental health, substance use, and neighborhood and school safety.

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey is part of an epidemiologic surveillance system established by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor the prevalence of youth behaviors and environments that most influence health. YRBS has been administered by CPS since 1991 and is conducted biennially.

#### Topics Covered in the YRBS include:

- Mental health
- Substance use
- Sexual health and health services
- Physical activity
- Community safety and violence
- Dietary behaviors
- School safety (bullying, weapons)
- Sexual and gender identity



#### What Data is Collected?

#### **District-level Data**

High School, Middle School, Networks 3 & 5

#### Demographic Data

- Age
- Sex
- Race/Ethnicity
- Gender Identity
- Sexual Identity

#### Mental Health Data

- Depression
- Suicidal thoughts
- Attempted suicide
- Suicide attempt that resulted in physical harm

#### Substance Use Data

- Alcohol
- Marijuana
- Tobacco Products
- Illicit drugs
- Opioids

#### Impacts of the COVID-19 Pandemic

#### High School Students

**29.5%** of students reported that a close family member, loved one, or caretaker passed away or died due to COVID-19

**33.7%** of students reported that their parent or other adult in their home lost their job during the pandemic (among parents that had a job before the pandemic started)

#### Middle School Students

**25.4%** of students reported that a close family member, loved one, or caretaker passed away or died due to COVID-19

**26.4%** of students reported that their parent or other adult in their home lost their job during the pandemic (among parents that had a job before the pandemic started)



#### **High School Mental Health**


60.3% of students agree or strongly agree that they feel close to people at their school

15.6% of students have seriously considered attempting suicide 43% of students have felt so sad or hopeless everyday for 2+ weeks they skipped usual activities

2019 YRBS: 38.2% of students



### Percentage of High School Students Who Felt Sad or Hopeless,\* 1999-2021<sup>+</sup>





\*Almost every day for >=2 weeks in a row so that they stopped doing some usual activities, ever during the 12 months before the survey tlncreased 1999-2021, no change 1999-2010, increased 2010-2021 [Based on linear and quadratic trend analyses using logistic regression models controlling for sex, race/ethnicity, and grade (p < 0.05).

#### Middle School Mental Health

**63.9%** of students agree or strongly agree that they feel close to people at their school

21.9% of students felt their mental health was most of the time or always not good

26.4% of students have seriously thought about committing suicide

On an average school night, **49.3%** of students **get 8+ hours of sleep** 



#### Mental Health Data - Middle School Students



**21.9%** of students' **mental health was most of the time or always not good** (including stress, anxiety, and depression) in the past 30 days

**26%** of students **most of the time or always get the kind of help they need** when they are feeling sad, empty, hopeless, angry, or anxious



#### **High School Substance Use**

16.8% of students have been offered, sold, or given an illegal drug on school property, in the past 12 months 29.5% of students have ever used marijuana

34% of students have ever used electronic vapor products Of students that have ever used electronic vapor products, 86.3% reported their first electronic vapor product was flavored



#### Middle School Substance Use

Of students that have ever used electronic vapor products, **49.4%** reported their **first electronic vapor product was flavored** 

**6.8%** of students have ever used **marijuana** 

12.2% of students have ever used electronic vapor products 20.6% of students have ever had a drink of alcohol, other than a few sips

#### Mental Health Data Disparities - LGBTQ+ Students

**1 in 6 LGBTQ+ students** attempted suicide

#### LGBTQ+ students are..

**Nearly 3X** more likely to report **feeling sad or hopeless** in the past 12 months compared to non-LGBTQ+ students

**Nearly 4X** more likely to report that they **attempted suicide** in the past 12 months compared to non-LGBTQ+ students



#### **Mental Health Disparities - Female Students**

Among female students... 58% felt sad or hopeless

**23.1%** seriously considered attempting suicide

**18.5%** made a plan about how they would attempt suicide

11.2% attempted suicide

**2.9%** attempted suicide and it resulted in an injury, poisoning, or overdose that needed treatment



1 in 9 female students attempted suicide

Female students are...

**2.5X** more likely to report **feeling sad or hopeless** in the past 12 months compared to male students

**Over 2X** more likely to **seriously consider attempting suicide** in the past 12 months compared to male students



#### **High School Safety and Violence**

LGBTQ+ students are **3.2 times** more likely to **experience sexual** dating violence **39.5%** of students have ever seen someone get physically attacked, beaten, stabbed, or shot in their neighborhood

In the 12 months before the survey, **15.9%** of students were in a **physical fight one or more times** 

On at least 1 day in the 30 days before completing the survey, **14.3%** of students **did not go to school because they felt unsafe at school or on their way to or from school** 

2019 YRBS: 10.1% of students



#### Middle School Safety and Violence

4% of students have ever slept away from their parents or guardians because they were kicked out, ran away, or were abandoned

35% of students have ever been bullied on school property

35.5% of students have ever seen someone get physically attacked, beaten, stabbed, or shot in their neighborhood

2019 YRBS: 10.1% of students

**48.4%** of students have ever been in a physical fight
