

The Chicago Department of Public Health and Chicago Public Library have partnered to make Narcan freely available in every public library in Chicago.

## **WHAT** is Narcan?

Narcan is the brand name of the medication naloxone. Naloxone saves lives by reversing an opioid overdose. In Illinois, individuals can carry and use naloxone without facing civil or criminal liability.

Narcan is nonaddictive and safe to use, even for those not experiencing an opioid overdose

## **WHY libraries?**

More people die each year in Chicago from opioid overdoses than from homicides and traffic crashes combined. Narcan prevents fatal overdose, but it can be expensive and inaccessible. Libraries are safe, accessible community spaces. This program lowers barriers to crucial harm reduction tools in every community in the city.

In 2021, over 1,426 people died of an opioid overdose in Chicago, the highest number ever recorded.

### **HOW** does it work?

CDPH trains librarians at every branch on opioid overdose prevention and how to use Narcan. The Narcan is available in small boxes on the wall at each library. Anyone can take Narcan from the box, no questions asked. However - if you do have questions, ask your local librarian!

# **WHAT** is the impact?

Between January 2022 - August 2023, this program has distributed over 10,000 Narcan kits to the community.

### WHERE are libraries with Narcan?

#### **Narcan at CPL Rollout Timeline**


CDPH and CPL rolled out this program by starting in libraries within communities with the highest numbers of opioid overdoses.
