I went to the civil trial and I can tell you 100 percent you need to get the deposition from the the transcript from the civil trial, because this boy lied three times at least. Like I said, the only thing served that day was bullets in my mother. And so where I was raised up on and growing up listening that serve and protect meant to be saved. So if you guys, your slogan and simply of serving and protecting don't represent that. I request that you get rid of him, because right now he speaks for all of you. He is a representation of all of you all. That is how I feel about the situation.

Shackleford? Next speaker, Rosemary Kade Porter?

MR. MONTERO: I'm with the Chicago Alliance Against Racist Political Repression. We are here to stand in for the family of 15-year old Dakota Bright who was unarmed and running away from Officer Brandon Ternand who murdered him. This Board's decision to reinstate this officer is an outrage. If this Board cannot fire an officer when the shooting was unjustified and the Police Superintendent said he should be fired, then you have the murder of an unarmed 15-year-old child who was 15 feet away from the officer, if this Board cannot fire this officer, you don't deserve to be called police accountability agency.

Furthermore, your decision coming days after the Van Dyke verdict shows how irrelevant when people of this City has sent a resounding message that we want an end to racism, police murders. Your

1	decision sends the opposite message that police
2	officers are free to kill unarmed children at will.
3	You make decisions that effect our life and liberty.
4	We have no say in those decisions. This is unjust and
5	it has to be remedied. As citizens across this city,
6	we demand representatives from this Board whom we can
7	hold accountable when they systematically hold the
8	police accountable. We want an accountability system
9	that represents us, not the Mayor's interest and not
10	your corporate interest. You won't protect us from
11	lethal abuse of power, because you don't represent us.
12	You don't represent us because we did not put you in
13	power. Your power is a political gift to you from the
14	Mayor. Like your decision to let officers on the
15	force. It is a gift of the FOP.
16	We demand the power you have, because
17	this accountability system is a failure in the city.

19	in a democracy and this Board is undemocratic, and we,
20	the people, are going to take the power you have and

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Grace Patino?

MS. PATINO: My name is Grace Patino and I am

here from the Chicago Alliance Against Racist and Political Repression. We come here today to stand in solidarity with Tansy Edwards as we are forced to yet again to recommend an unjust system that failed to hold police officers accountable for their crimes. The unacceptable murder of Dakota Bright of the tender age of 13 is not unrelated to Laquan McDonald or Bettie Jones or Antonio LeGrier, nor is it unrelated to the sexual assault of Trina Thompson or the recent beating of Thomas Stacha and John Sherwood outside of the gay bar where I live in the 48th Ward. The City has proven time and time again that the police are unable to police themselves and elect a Police Accountability Council.

As noted in the report of the use of force incident against children between January 2011 and April 2016 black children were on the receiving end in and 83 percent of the cases. Latinos were in 14 percent of the cases. And by reinstating Ternand, you are not only letting a known murderer back on the street, but you are supplying him with a gun and the authority to murder with impunity again. So the blood will continue to be on all of your hands as the murders of civilians will continue, because they will continue.

have that would eliminate the Police Board's power and overturning the finding of police misconduct. And to listen to the over 52,000 civilians that have signed on to support CPAC shows how out of touch this City really is. We want community control over how this City is policed. We want Justice for Dakota Bright and CPAC now.

MR. RAGSDALE: Good evening. Can you let me know when I have five seconds left? So I stand before you because I'm strong supporter of CPAC. The Civilian Police Accountability Council, which has 55,000 petitions. You were not elected by us. You were appointed by us. So we are here to appeal to whatever conscience you have, whatever soul you have, whatever spirit you have in your heart, because we are black and brown people to suffer from your inability to show your humanity.

Officer Ternand has 24 civilian

complaints ranking him among the top 12 officers with

the highest complaints. He was named in six misconduct

lawsuits, yet the Board praised him. The decision to

reinstate Officer Ternand just days after Van Dyke was

convicted shows just how out of touch and irrelevant

you are to our community.

We demand respect from you. And when we get CPAC, you will not be part of us for what you are doing today. And remember this day. Remember that we as a people are saying to you, without a soul and conscience, our humanity will show you what democracy is. You have no right to make your money and make poor people suffer in the way that you have in the decisions that you make for not holding the police accountable. I don't know who your family is. I don't know who your love ones are. I know my family who I love. I love dark and brown people. If you can sit before us and not care about our city the way that you should, then shame on you. Shame on each and every one of you.

MS. ALEXANDER: Hello, everybody. How you

doing? I know you are sleepy. Everybody looks sleepy up there. Well, I'm say something real quick. What I called for, is that okay. Officer Rialmo. My mom died in 2006. I want to say it was just after the Mayor was elected. There was a situation with my brother where the police chased my brother to the house. My daughter came in and running in she was hysterical. I go outside and see just like a sea of police cars and guns drawn and Officer Rialmo. As I came out, "You black bitch. Get back in the house." I immediately said, "What?" I couldn't believe that came from an officer's mouth. I could not believe that.

There was a young man after that that was using my mother's house, because basically she was home alone, and saying that dope was being sold out of there. I called the police. They sent Officer Rialmo. The young lady that was standing next to the Sergeant that my cousin said, "This is unacceptable. What are you going to do about him.?" And he said, "I'm going to let Rahm Emanuel know." And the young lady said, F, Rahm Emanuel." Right next to the white shirt and laughed. That was very disrespectful.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Thirty seconds.

MS. ALEXANDER: Okay. My situation is this.

My mother died in 2016, March 6th. The Chicago Police came to my house. They have been coming for like two years back and forth trying to intimidate us to get out of the house. We're in Probate Court. They didn't want to go to Probate Court. One of the people said "F Probate Court." They came to my house on September 10th.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: You have to wrap it up.

MS. ALEXANDER: Took the front door off and the back door off. I'm like "Where is the paperwork?" There was no paperwork. The neighbor said the Chicago Police did this. Then they came back on September 14th.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Can I ask you to have a conversation with COPA?

MS. ALEXANDER: COPA hasn't really done anything. The lady that I am supposed to be talking to, I go to the police station to talk to her, she is retired. She called me last week. How do you retire and called me last week.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Speak to COPA.

MS. ALEXANDER: Okay. Here it is. Today is the last day to get things out of the house. By me being homeless, I lost my job after the second time.

They said I had too many family emergencies. I became homeless. I found a place now. I'm trying to get my things. The court order that I have right here says that I have until today that I was to contact them at my disposal. I did that five days ago. Nothing happened. They told me that they couldn't get me in until after the 15th. And after the 15th they could take my belongings.

I went to the Chicago Police Department and showed them the order. I have an admit or deny signed by a judge. That says that I could get my things. The Sergeant, I got his name written somewhere, told me that I couldn't get anything. He couldn't do anything. Now here is the order. I'm passing it down for you to look at it. That is the order from a Judge signed by a Judge. The order signed by a Judge, that is law. He told me he couldn't do anything. I said, sir, you are a Sergeant. I'm showing you an official order.

I go to the Cook County Sheriff Police

Department and they said go to your neighborhood police
station. Chicago Police evicted me, Officer Egan and

15 other officers. They have no jurisdiction. They
called me a squatter. I'm not a squatter.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: So can I ask afterward could you have a conversation with COPA, Superintendent from the Police Department should have a conversation with --

5 MS. ALEXANDER: I would like to go to my 6 house.

MS. ALEXANDER: I have three court orders.

One out of Florida in two years.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Next speaker, Bridget McGee? Next Mark Clements.

MR. CLEMENTS: Hello, I represent CPAC. I represent the campaign to end torture as well as Chicago Torture Justice Center. You know, guess what, since 1972 we had a detective by the name of John Burge. You all missed the ball. Not only did you miss the ball on John Burge. I know I have two minutes. Not only did you miss the ball on John Burge, but you created a capybara. Now these mothers they are suffering inside a prison. I'm one of those convicts. Served 28 years inside of a prison. You took away my goddam youth. When you took away my goddam youth, you let me out of a goddam prison and told me guess what,

"Have a happy life."

Not only is the City of Chicago responsible for what occurred to me, they are also responsible for what took place with Bettie Jones and responsible for what took place with any and every one of these individuals that are here today. Accountability. What does accountability look like? Accountability means taking action. Taking action. I'm not talking about having a Klan goddam meeting up here, but taking goddam action and realizing there is still 100 victims still inside of the goddam prison and it could be your relatives.

You serve as a federal prosecutor in several other positions. I know who you are. I know who you are too, Sister. The bottom line of it is cut the goddam football game. Get to the goddam truth and let these goddam people out of these prisons, back to their goddam families. End of fucking discussion.

PRESIDENT FOREMAN: Next speaker, John Perryman.

MR. PERRYMAN: I'm here to talk about the many shootings that have been happening along Francisco near Madison. I'm here with several neighbors who have

come out. This is on the edge of the 11th and 12th District. I'm asking that both districts be for failed strategy in our community. You do not want to listen to the community? I met with the candidate for the 11th and his response was "We're working on it." Keep calling 9-1-1, which is what causes all these problems. We are calling 9-1-1. The police are coming out with no information from the community. We also have a trouble business in the 12th, which is a hub. I talked to the 12th District and they said you live in the is 11th District so you should talk to the Desk Sergeant.

I guess my question for you is this. I have a couple -- what is the policy between the 11th and 12th working together? They are worried about Madison being the dividing line and actually serving. So my question to you, Superintendent Johnson is, what is the policy with the 11th and 12th working together?

SUPERINTENDENT JOHNSON: Although, we don't manage them from the headquarters, 11th and 12th should be working together. You should have a voice of what is going on. I will make sure that you connect with the correct people.

MR. PERRYMAN: One more ask or two more asks.

Can we have the Commander of the 11th and the 12th along with who is in charge of CAPS, because the CAPS is a disaster over there. They just rescue barbecues and ice tee when people are getting shot up. We've had a huge spike in shootings. So my question is can we have those three people be at the next meeting to answer on public record about how they are working together to help our community?

SUPERINTENDENT JOHNSON: I will definitely insure that occurs.

MR. PERRYMAN: And the last one, we have several trouble buildings and a troubled business. Can we ask that those buildings be fast tracked in any actions that have been taken by the City? We can give you a list on our way out. But the community is struggling, because there is an open air drug market. The police don't want to hear from the community. It has been going on for decades and there has been a huge spike. A man was shot two doors from my house and shooting in front of her house and her house. She was right behind someone when someone was shooting from a car. And I know the police don't seem to mind when black people kill black people. It seems like this. This is a problem in our community.

This was five months ago. She told me she would look into it and never got back to me. I think that should have been turned over to make her If your guys are basically shopping for the right answer before you push your decision forward, when you've got two people that you paid for and that wasn't good enough and stick it in the drawer and find someone so you could put a guy out to dry. could look, I'm going to be back for an answer, whether

it is you or her. She promised me an answer. you.

Superintendent, the definition of "obstruction" is a person who obstructs justice with the intent to prevent the apprehension or obstruct the prosecution or defense of any person he or she knowing commits a crime of the following acts, destroy, alters or conceals physical evidence. There was a case report generated against you for trespassing on the Dan Ryan in the summertime. Commander of the 8th district who is now in the 17th District ordered his subordinates to scrub that report from the system to protect you. Why does he still got a job? How is that not obstruction of justice? You had police officers hanging out to dry for the Van Dyke shooting for obstructing and colluding. He's a Commander, a Commander who is in charge of people and did that. Anyone with a blue shirt would have been stripped immediately, sent to call back, and fired from this Board within weeks. But yet, it is another example of how anybody with a white shirt and fancy pins on his shirt never gets held accountable. Explain that to me, please? SUPERINTENDENT JOHNSON: I really have no

MS. CORLEY: I am Ellen Corley. I have been involved, a volunteer with the Alliance Against Racist Political Repression for the last three years. started with Obama Organizing for Action Fellow Program looking at how to stop gun violence. My background is market research and investigative journalism methods. And as I have researched this, the question in the back of my mind is why no investigation? There is tons of evidence, the most recent on you, Commander Eddie Johnson, that was in the paper about your role as supervising the -- cases and all the coverups, the Laguan McDonald. I have been watching, going down to the courtrooms with the Gerald Reed case. Cops, he's a torture victim. Been in jail, wrongfully imprisoned. There are 80 cops who tortured -- putting wires on the balls, hitting them over the head and forcing young black men, estimated one-third of the people in prisons are wrongfully convicted. I was in the Center for Wrongful Conviction and Northwestern. The problem is, I figured it out, why no investigation? They are being stopped from the top. These are state crimes. All of you against

democracy. It is starting with the gestapo, Nazi type of state that could cover up its own crimes. You protect the state. Just like the FOP is not really a Union. It is representing you, the managers, the ones at the top, the state. This is criminal. This has to be -- who do you go to. You have looked around. You go to the Inspector General. He has been captured. Do you have any comment to that. Are you all mandated reporters to investigate your own corruption. That is what is going to be exposed. That is why I'm running for City Clerk. Something is going to change.

MS. HENNING: I want to express my condolence for those who have lost their loved ones. Now, I got to get to the bottom of this. Superintendent Eddie Johnson, I was awarded millions of dollars back in 2007 only to find out that the New York Police came down here and took my money and infiltrated it through gangs.
