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MAYOR EMANUEL, DEPARTMENT OF FLEET AND FACILITY MANAGEMENT INTRODUCE LEASE UTILIZING VACANT FORMER FIRE STATION AS COMMUNITY CENTER

Mayor Rahm Emanuel and the Department of Fleet and Facility Management today introduced an ordinance authorizing the execution of a lease agreement to support The Exodus Drum & Bugle Corps' community center project. The lease will allow the organization to transform a vacant former fire station into a community center in the Austin neighborhood.

"This new community center will help enhance the lives of residents in the Austin neighborhood by offering positive programming and a space to gather to help foster a sense of community," said Mayor Emanuel. "The partnership with The Exodus Drum & Bugle Corps is another way we are investing in neighborhoods and creating productive use for vacant City space."

The community center will be developed at a vacant City-owned lot located at 816 North Laramie Avenue by granting a \$1 lease to The Exodus Drum & Bugle Corps, valid through December 31, 2021. The building once served as a community center operated by the Mid-Austin Steering Committee, but has remained vacant since it was forced to close in 2015.

The Exodus Drum & Bugle Corps will be responsible for maintaining the property, thereby reducing the City's maintenance responsibility.

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
