The attached information is in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 1, 2019 to discuss the proposed 2020 budget.

All contracts awarded by the Department of Procurement Services (DPS) contain a prompt payment provision, which requires the prime contractor to pay its subcontractors within seven days of its receipt of payment from the City for that work. DPS takes contractor compliance with the prompt payment provision seriously and expects contractors to pay their subcontractors for work performed in a timely manner.

DPS currently utilizes the Certification and Compliance (C2) system, a web-based software, for verifying payments to subcontractors. The software allows DPS to track and verify payments made to subcontractors. However, it does not provide notification to DPS if a subcontractor is not paid in a manner that complies with the prompt payment requirements.

Currently, DPS learns of payment issues when contacted by a prime contractor, subcontractor, or the user department for the contract. When contacted by a prime contractor about non-payment by the City, DPS assists by reaching out to the user department to learn if there are any reasons why payment is being withheld. If a subcontractor contacts DPS to inform DPS that it has not been paid, DPS assists by hosting meetings with the prime contractor, the subcontractor(s), and internal stakeholders to discuss payment issues, and if the issue is not resolved by the meetings, will issue

a notice to cure or notice of default to the prime contractor. DPS can also terminate a contract if a prime contractor fails to promptly pay its subcontractors.

DPS has recently advertised a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a replacement software for the C2 system. As part of the RFP process, DPS will ask proposers to provide information regarding the proposed software's capability to provide DPS with a notification if a vendor is not promptly paying its subcontractors and to generate a report on the length of time between payment by the City to the prime contractor and payment from the prime contractor to its subcontractors.

DPS reached out to the Department of Finance (DOF) for information related to this question. Please note user departments receive invoices and thus track the timeframe to process invoices at the department level. DOF tracks time from the date that it receives the completed and reviewed invoice from the department to the date the payment has been validated. Average number of calendar days it takes to process an invoice once received by the Comptroller's office is:

The attached information is in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 1, 2019 to discuss the proposed 2020 budget.

Alderman Ervin requested a list of bid incentives that are currently available.

The City of Chicago has created numerous bid incentives to increase the pool of bidders on City contracts, incentivize the use of small minority and women-owned businesses, build capacity of local businesses, and encourage the employment of local residents. These incentives are a direct result of the City's key priorities in procurement: creating opportunities for businesses of all sizes and helping businesses grow so that they can participate in the business of Chicago.

The following is a list of bid incentives applicable to City-funded construction contracts, City-funded non-construction contracts, or both City-funded construction and non-construction programs on competitive bids advertised by the Department of Procurement Services (DPS).

#### **Construction Only:**

**Apprentice Utilization**: Designed as an incentive to encourage City prime contractors to utilize apprentices on construction projects with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- "Apprentice" means any person who is:
  - sponsored into an apprenticeship training program by a contractor that is authorized by a union to sponsor apprentices; and
  - enrolled in, or has graduated from, a construction technology training program administered by the City Colleges of Chicago, or is a graduate of a high school operated by Chicago Public Schools.
- An Earned Credit Certification can be applied to future contracts if the contractor meets its commitments at the end of the contract.
- The Earned Credit is valid for 3 years but can only be used to win one contract award.
- Tiered Incentive:
  - 5-10% work performed by apprentice results in ½% bid incentive.
  - 11-15% project-area subcontractor work results in 1% bid incentive.

**Equal Employment Opportunity**: Designed as an incentive to increase the utilization of minority and women journey workers, apprentices, and laborers on construction projects with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- Using a canvassing formula, bidders propose minority and women utilization levels as a percentage of work hours on the project
- The incentive has a commitment cap of 15% for female workers and 70% for minority workers. This cap is only for purposes of calculating the incentive and is not meant to discourage higher utilization.
- The Bidder will be given a 150% credit for every work hour performed by a minority or female worker residing in a socio-economically disadvantaged area
  - After completing the numerical calculations set forth in the canvassing formula, the final calculation represents the "award criteria figure" by which Bids will be compared

**Ex-Offender Apprentice Utilization:** Designed as an incentive for City prime contractors to sponsor and utilize ex-offender apprentices for construction projects with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- DFSS works with delegate agencies to recruit, screen, and refer potential qualified candidates. All candidates go through an initial intake process where their eligibility for this program will be determined.
- An Earned Credit Certification can be applied to future contracts if the contractor meets its commitments at the end of the contract.
  - The Earned Credit is valid for 3 years but can only be used to win one contract award.
- Tiered Incentive:
  - 5-10% work performed by apprentice results in ½% bid incentive.
  - 11-15% project-area subcontractor work results in 1% bid incentive.

**Project Area Subcontractors Utilization:** Designed as an incentive for City prime contractors to utilize project-area subcontractors for construction projects.

Key Points:

- The subcontractor must be a small business (based on SBA size standards); conduct meaningful day-to-day business at a facility in the project area that is the place of employment for the majority of its regular, full time workforce; and hold all required City licenses and be subject to City taxes.
- Tiered Incentive:
  - 1-16% project-area subcontractor work results in 0.5% bid incentive.
  - 17-32% project-area subcontractor work results in 1% bid incentive.
  - 33-49% project-area subcontractor work results in 1.5% bid incentive.
  - 50% or more project-area subcontractor work results in 2% bid incentive.

**Veteran-owned subcontractor utilization:** Applies to contracts for construction projects and is designed to encourage the utilization of veteran-owned subcontractors in the performance of the contract.

Key Points:

- Bidder must be a veteran-owned small local business (VBE) or utilize VBEs as subcontractors.
- Tiered incentive based on the Bidder's commitment to the use of veteran-owned subcontractors in the performance of the contract:
  - 1 to 16% commitment results in a 0.5% incentive;
  - 17 to 32% commitment results in a 1% incentive;
  - 33 to 49% commitment results in a 1.5% incentive; and
  - 50% or greater commitment results in a 2% incentive.

#### **Non-Construction Only:**

**City-Based Manufacturers:** Designed to increase contracting/supply opportunities and participation by city-based manufacturers on contracts for goods with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- Manufacturer must be licensed, taxed and operating in the City.
- Tiered Incentive:
  - Goods provided equals 25-49% results in 1% bid incentive.
  - Goods provided equals 50-74% results in 1.5% bid incentive.
  - Goods provided equals 75% or more results in 2% bid incentive.

#### **Both Construction and Non-Construction:**

**Mentor/Protégé:** Designed to increase the participation and capacity of MBEs and WBEs in City contracting by making M/WBE mentoring eligible for an incentive of 1%.

- A written mentor/protégé agreement must be approved by the CPO.
- The Mentor/Protégé Agreement must be designed to assist protégé in becoming selfsustaining, competitive and profitable.
- The prime can mentor an MBE/WBE or its subcontractor(s) can mentor an MBE/WBE.

**Alternatively Powered Vehicles:** Designed as an incentive for Cvendors to use alternatively powered vehicles in their business fleet on contracts with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- Eligible business must be located in the six county region <u>and</u>
- a majority of fleet (at least 10 vehicles) are located and used in six county region and
- the majority of those vehicles are alternatively powered.
- Alternatively powered vehicles are fueled by alternative fuel including, but not limited to, natural gas, liquefied petroleum gas, hydrogen, ethanol E85, and electricity.
- $\frac{1}{2}$ % bid incentive.

**Business Enterprises owned or operated by People with Disabilities:** Designed to increase contracting opportunities and participation by business enterprises owned or operated by people with disabilities.

Key Points:

- The incentive can be earned through the utilization of a BEPD prime or subcontractor.
- Must be certified as BEPD by the City.
- Tiered Incentive:
- Participation of 2-5% results in 1% bid incentive.
- Participation of 6-9% results in 2% bid incentive.
- Participation of 10-13% results in 3% incentive.
- Participation of 14% or more results in 4% incentive.

**City-Based Businesses:** Designed to increase contracting opportunities and participation by city based businesses on contracts with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- 4% bid incentive if the bidder is a City-based business that conducts meaningful day-today business from a facility in the City, the majority of regular, full-time employees work out of the City facility, the firm holds all City licenses, and is subject to applicable City taxes.
- 6% bid incentive if the bidder qualifies for the 4% and majority of regular, full-time workforce are City residents.
- 8% bid incentive if the bidder qualifies for the 6% and the majority of its City resident workforce lives in socio-economically disadvantaged areas.

**Incentive to Encourage Utilization of MBE/WBEs:** Designed as an incentive to encourage participation of MBEs and WBEs on contracts where no goals can be assigned.

- On certain contracts, the City cannot set MBE/WBE participation goals because an insufficient number of certified firms are available; this bid incentive is available on these 0%/0% goals contracts.
- To be eligible for the incentive, a compliance plan must be submitted with the bid.
- MBE/WBE participation can be at the prime or sub level; and can be direct or indirect.
- Tiered Incentive based on M/WBE participation as a percentage of the contract value:
  - 5% results in a 0.75% incentive
  - 10% results in a 1% incentive
  - 15% results in a 1.25% incentive
  - 20% results in a 1.5% incentive
  - 25% results in a 1.75% incentive
  - 30% results in a 2% incentive

**Veteran-owned and Small Businesses JV** + **VBE:** Designed to increase contracting opportunities and participation by small-local veteran-owned business enterprises (VBEs) and eligible joint ventures consisting of one or more small local business enterprises (SBEs) in combination with one or more veteran-owned business enterprises. It applies to contracts with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- A VBE can qualify by itself no need to JV with another business
- VBEs must have 51% or more veteran ownership and must be certified by the City
- For JVs:
  - All members must be an SBE, veteran-owned business, or both,
  - At least one member must be a veteran-owned businesses,
  - All SBEs must collectively have at least 30% interest in the JV,
  - All veteran-owned businesses must collectively have at least 30% interest in the JV,
  - The JV partners must self-perform at least 20% of the work, and
  - None of the JV members may act as brokers.
  - Eligible bidders can earn a 5% bid incentive.

**Diverse Work Force and Management:** Designed to encourage contractors to employ a diverse workforce and management. Applies to contracts with an estimated value of \$100,000 or more.

Key Points:

- Bidder must have a diverse workforce and/or diverse management
- Tiered incentive based on percentage of workforce that is diverse and percentage of management that is diverse:
  - Diverse Workforce:
    - 10-20% results in 2% incentive
    - >20-40% results in 4% incentive
    - >40% results in 6% incentive
  - Diverse Management:
    - 10-20% results in 0.5% incentive
    - >20-40% results in 2% incentive
    - >40% results in 4% incentive

As requested at our Budget Hearing, DPS intends to engage Chicago Housing Authority in discussions about its JOC program and its impact on MBE and WBE firms and will continue to engage the City's sister agencies to discuss best practices on all aspects of procurement, including bid incentives and programs.

The attached information is in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 1, 2019 to discuss the proposed 2020 budget.

Alderman Lopez requested additional information regarding the ex-offender bid incentive.

The Ex-Offender Apprentice Utilization Bid Incentive, which was created in 2016, supports individuals who were previously incarcerated but are re-entering the workforce and making efforts to obtain ongoing education and training.

Under Section 2-92-336 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the incentive is available on all Cityfunded construction contracts with an estimated value of \$100,000 and allows bidders to apply for a future incentive of up to 1 percent of the contract base bid in exchange for utilizing eligible apprentices during the performance of the work.

This incentive is unique in that bidders earn a "earned credit certificate" that can be applied to a future contract. In order to receive the earned credit certificate, a bidder must commit to utilizing eligible ex-offender apprentices at the time of bid and at contract close-out, must demonstrate that it met those commitments.

The incentive is a tiered incentive based on the total labor hours performed by eligible apprentices: if 5 to 10 percent of the total labor hours are performed by ex-offender apprentices, the bid

incentive will be 0.5 percent of the contract base bid; and if 11 to 15 percent of the labor hours are performed by ex-offender apprentices, the bid incentive will be one percent of the contract base bid.

The ex-offender incentive is an example of the City's commitment to ensuring that residents from all walks of life have access to and benefit from City construction projects and infrastructure improvements.

## EX-OFFENDER APPRENTICE UTILIZATION BID INCENTIVE

The ex-offender apprentice utilization bid incentive (the "Incentive") is designed to increase the sponsorship and utilization of, and to create opportunities for, City residents who are ex-offenders. The Incentive is based upon a bidder's commitment to utilize ex-offender apprentices in the performance of City-funded construction contracts valued at \$100,000 or more. Bidders who commit to the utilization of ex-offender apprentices on an eligible City contract may be eligible to earn an incentive, of up to one (1) percent of the contract base bid, which may be applied to a future bid on a City project. Section 2-92-336(d) of the Municipal Code of Chicago ("MCC") grants the Chief Procurement Officer ("CPO") the authority to adopt, promulgate and enforce these rules pertaining to the administration and enforcement of the Incentive.

DEPARTMENT OF

PROCUREMENT

#### I. Definitions.

"Apprentice" means any person who is: (1) sponsored into an apprenticeship training program by a contractor that is authorized by a union to sponsor apprentices; (2) participating in a workforce development program of a delegate agency that receives funding from the Department of Family and Support Services; and (3) an exoffender. The union's apprenticeship training program must be registered with the United States Department of Labor, or approved or recognized by the State of Illinois. For purposes of this definition, "participating in" means the duration of the pertinent contract or one year, whichever is less.

"Bid incentive" means an amount deducted, for bid evaluation purposes only, from the contract base bid in order to calculate the bid price to be used to evaluate the bid on a competitively bid construction project.

"Construction project" means any project to be paid for by the City, but which is not funded in whole or part by any federal or state funds, to construct, remodel or reconstruct any public works, public buildings, public structures, roadways, parkways, bridges, parking facilities or parks, or any portion of any of the same, belonging to the City within its geographical boundaries as they exist or shall exist in the future.

"Contract base bid" means the total dollar amount a contractor bids on a construction project without factoring any bid incentive or percentage reductions to the bid amount.

"Earned credit" means the amount of the bid incentive allocated to a contractor upon completion of a construction project in which the contractor met or exceeded his or her goals for the utilization of apprentices in performance of the total labor hours performed under the contract.

"Earned credit certificate" means a certificate issued by the chief procurement officer evidencing the amount of earned credit a contractor has been awarded.

"Ex-offender" means a resident of the City of Chicago who has been convicted of an imprisonable offense under the Illinois Criminal Code or another state's penal statute.

"Labor hours" means the total hours of workers receiving an hourly wage who are directly employed at the work site. "Labor hours" shall include hours performed by workers employed by the contractor and all subcontractors working at the work site. "Labor hours" shall not include hours worked by non-working foremen, superintendents, owners and workers who are not subject to prevailing wage requirements.





#### II. Procedure.

A. For any construction project, advertised after the effective date of Section 2-92-336 of the MCC, having an estimated contract value of \$100,000.00 or more, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal, state or local law, the CPO shall allocate to any qualified bidder the following bid incentive for utilization of apprentices in the performance of the total labor hours performed under the contract:

| Total Labor Hours Performed By Apprentices | Bid Incentive                 |
|--|-------------------------------|
| 5 to 10%                                   | 1/2% of the contract base bid |
| 11 to 15%                                  | 1% of the contract base bid   |

The bid incentive is used only to calculate an amount to be used in evaluating the bid. The bid incentive does not affect the contract price.

- B. The Chief Procurement Officer is authorized to limit or preclude the use of apprentices for a particular contract if she determines, following consultation with the Commissioner of Family and Support Services, that the nature of the underlying offense raises concerns of suitability for that contract.
- C. As part of the contract close-out procedure, if the CPO determines that the contractor has successfully met its apprentice utilization goals, the CPO shall issue an earned credit certificate that evidences the amount of earned credits allocated to the contractor.
- D. The earned credit certificate is valid for three years from the date of issuance and shall not be applied towards any future contract bid after the expiration of that period.
- E. The contractor may apply the earned credit as follows:
  - a. As the bid incentive for any future construction project contract bid of equal or greater dollar value; and
  - b. On multiple future construction project contract bids during the three-year period in which the certificate is valid. Once the Incentive has been utilized in an awarded contract in the three-year period, the Incentive cannot be used again.
- F. If the earned credit certificate is applied on multiple construction project bids and the contractor is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder on more than one construction project bid, the earned credit certificate shall be applied to the construction project first to be advertised by DPS. To the extent that multiple construction project bids were advertised on the same date, the earned credit certificate shall be applied only to the construction project with the greatest dollar value.

The attached information is in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 1, 2019 to discuss the proposed 2020 budget.

Alderman Lopez requested the list of contracts for smaller business that could be created by unbundling CDOT and DWM projections.

Please see the attached buying plan for both CDOT and DWM. DPS publishes a Buying Plan that is updated quarterly and forecasts contracting opportunities six quarters into the future. Information that is published in the Buying Plan includes: User Department, Contract Category, Project Description, Estimated Term, Estimated Advertising Date, Subcontracting Opportunities and Funding Source. The latest version of the Buying Plan is always available on homepage of the DPS website: <u>www.chicago.gov/dps</u>. The contracting opportunity submissions from CDOT and DWM for the most recent Buying Plan are attached to this response.

In addition to itemizing all projected opportunities, each quarter user departments identify projects that they plan to bid through one of three key programs that are designed to build capacity for small and growing businesses: Small Business Initiative (SBI), Mid-Sized Business Initiative (MBI) or Target Market. These opportunities are highlighted in each quarterly Buying Plan.

SBI projects are exclusive to small local businesses for locally funded construction projects that are under \$3 million in total cost. The program is divided into two tiers: SBI I projects are valued

between \$3 million and \$2 million and can only be bid on by firms that are at SBA size standards or smaller and that are at least 51% owned by individuals whose personal net worth does not exceed the limit set forth in Section 2-92-670 of the Municipal Code of Chicago (MCC). SBI II projects are less than \$2 million in total value; firms must be ½ SBA size standards or smaller and must be at least 51% owned by individuals whose personal net worth is no more than ½ the limits set forth in Section 2-92-670 of the MCC to bid.

MBI projects are exclusive to small and mid-sized local businesses and limited to locally funded construction projects that are between \$3-20 million. The program is also divided into two tiers: MBI I for projects valued between \$10-20 million for firms no greater than two times SBA size standards and at least 51% owned by individuals whose personal net worth is not greater than two times the limits set forth in Section 2-92-670 of the MCC. MBI II projects are valued at \$3-10 million for firms no greater than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times SBA size standards and at least 51% owned by individuals whose personal net worth is not greater than 2-92-670 of the MCC.

The Target Market program was created to offer exclusive opportunities for MBE/WBEs on nonconstruction contracts including for professional services such as Architecture, Engineers, or IT, work services, and commodities. This program allows prime level opportunities exclusively for minority and women-owned certified firms.

As a part of our efforts to create more opportunities for small, local businesses including MBEs and WBEs, DPS also encourages City departments to review solicitations and specifications for ways to unbundle projects or separate large projects into smaller projects and divide work among lower capacity contractors.

To remind departments of the importance of creating opportunities for firms of all sizes, DPS intends to send a memo in early 2020 to all City departments to remind them to review each project to determine whether portions of the project could be "unbundled" or bid separately. DPS will also encourage departments to create bid packages and scopes of work that are of a manageable size for M/WBE and small businesses.

# CITY OF CHICAGO CREATING OPPORTUNITIES for businesses of all sizes

The Department of Procurement Services (DPS) has created numerous programs and to increase the pool of bidders on City contracts and incentivize the use of small, local, minority, and women-owned businesses. This includes the Small Business Initiative (SBI), Mid-Size Business Initiative (MBI), and Target Market Programs.

#### SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE (SBI)

- Exclusive to small businesses and limited to construction projects that are under \$3 million in total cost.
- Divided into two tiers: SBI I projects that are \$3 million or less.
  SBI II – projects that are \$2 million in total cost or less and must meet ½ size standards from SBA.

#### MID-SIZE BUSINESS INITIATIVE (MBI)

- Exclusive to small and mid-sized local (six counties) businesses and limited to construction projects that are between \$3-20 million.
- Divided into two tiers: MBI I \$10-20 million and firms no greater than two times SBA size standards. MBI II – \$3-10 million and firms no greater than 1½ times size standards.

#### TARGET MARKET PROGRAM

- Target Market was created to offer exclusive opportunities for MBE/WBEs in professional services fields, such as Architecture, Engineers, or IT.
- Allows prime level opportunities for minority and women-owned certified firms.

# 4Q 2019 BUYING PLAN OPPORTUNITIES

# SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE (SBI) & MID-SIZE BUSINESS INITIATIVE (MBI)

The City's key priorities in procurement are creating opportunities for businesses of all sizes, and helping businesses grow so that they can participate in the business of Chicago. The Small Business Initiative (SBI) is exclusive to small businesses and limited to construction projects that are under \$3 million in total cost. The Mid-Sized Business Initiative (MBI) is for small and mid-sized local construction firms to bid on construction projects valued between \$3 million and \$10 million. Expands the SBI I & II construction programs. The Target Market Program promotes contracting opportunities exclusively to businesses that are certified as minority or women-owned business enterprises.. # CITY OF CHICAGO CREATING OPPORTUNITIES for businesses of all sizes

The Department of Procurement Services (DPS) has created numerous programs and to increase the pool of bidders on City contracts and incentivize the use of small, local, minority, and women-owned businesses. This includes the Small Business Initiative (SBI), Mid-Size Business Initiative (MBI), and Target Market Programs.

#### SMALL BUSINESS INITIATIVE (SBI)

- Exclusive to small businesses and limited to construction projects that are under \$3 million in total cost.
- Divided into two tiers: SBI I projects that are \$3 million or less.
  SBI II – projects that are \$2 million in total cost or less and must meet ½ size standards from SBA.

#### MID-SIZE BUSINESS INITIATIVE (MBI)

- Exclusive to small and mid-sized local (six counties) businesses and limited to construction projects that are between \$3-20 million.
- Divided into two tiers: MBI I \$10-20 million and firms no greater than two times SBA size standards. MBI II – \$3-10 million and firms no greater than 1½ times size standards.

#### TARGET MARKET PROGRAM

- Target Market was created to offer exclusive opportunities for MBE/WBEs in professional services fields, such as Architecture, Engineers, or IT.
- Allows prime level opportunities for minority and women-owned certified firms.

The City's standard construction contracts for DWM contain four parts – Book 1 (Standard Terms and Conditions), Book 2 (Instructions and Execution Documents), Book 3 (Technical Specifications), and Book 4 (Construction Drawings). The specifications found in Book 3 contain all the technical requirements for the required work. The terms and conditions found in Book 1 and instructions found in Book 2 are drafted and approved by the Department of Law.

The contracts listed above can be found on DPS's website at the following link: <u>https://webapps1.chicago.gov/vcsearch/contracts</u>. Due to the voluminous nature of these contracts, however, only Book 2 is viewable for each contract. DPS has the specifications for each contract in its possession and is willing to meet with Alderman Lopez, and any other interested Aldermen, to review the specifications and terms and conditions. The provisions relating to performance of the work and corrective work from the standard terms and conditions are set forth below for your convenience:

# "Correction of Work" – Book 1, Section VII.B:

- 1. You must, upon discovery of any defective or non-conforming Work, or when directed in writing by the Commissioner, promptly re-perform, correct or remove all Work identified to be defective or as failing to conform to the standards set forth in, or any requirement of the Contract, whether or not completed. You must bear all costs of correcting the defective or non-conforming Work, including costs associated with removing any defective or non-conforming Work, replacing the defective or non-conforming Work and any compensation for any additional equipment, materials and/or services made necessary by the removal and replacement.
  - \*\*\*
- 4. Neither the determination of Final Completion and Acceptance of the Work, nor payment, nor any provisions in the Contract will relieve you of responsibility for defective or non-conforming Work, faulty materials, equipment or workmanship, and unless otherwise specified, you must remedy any defects due to the foregoing

and pay for any damage to the Work or other property resulting from defective or non-conforming Work, or faulty materials, equipment or workmanship throughout the Warranty Period, as defined in Section VII.E, "Warranties," below, or such other period of time afforded by industry custom or law, whichever is longer. The City will give you written notice of the observed defects with reasonable promptness.

### "Warranties" – Book 1, Section VII.E:

1. You warrant all Work furnished under this Contract against defective materials and workmanship, improper performance and non-compliance with the Contract for a period of one year after the date of Final Completion and Acceptance of the Work ("Warranty Period"), except as otherwise specifically stated in other parts of the Contract or within such longer periods of time as may be provided by law or by the manufacturer, which periods will then become the Warranty Period as applicable. Your warranty will be in addition to any Manufacturers' Warranties.

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4. You must bear all costs associated with any repair or replacement under this section, including removal, material, transportation, and reinstallation.

#### "Contractor Must Comply with All Laws" - Book 1, Section XXI.A:

Contractor must observe and comply with all Applicable Laws, in effect now or later and whether or not they appear in the Agreement, including those specifically referenced herein or in any of the Contract Documents. Contractor must pay all taxes and obtain all licenses, certificates and other authorizations required in connection with the performance of its obligations hereunder, and Contractor must require all subcontractors to do so. Contractor is fully responsible for ascertaining and complying with all agency and code requirements applicable to the Work.

Alderman Lopez requested information on local company participation as part of the Chicago Department of Transportation's ("CDOT") annual Aldermanic Menu program (the "Program").

CDOT administers the Program in order to fund capital improvement projects throughout the city. Much of the work selected by alderman pertains to street resurfacing, sidewalks, and similar capital projects. For Program purposes, the city is divided into eight (8) areas and CDOT has contracted with five (5) vendors to undertake the capital the work that aldermen have selected. These vendors are Sumit Construction, Capital Cement, 7D, G &V Construction, and MQ Construction. Lighting work under the Program is performed by John Burns and Aldridge Electric. All companies must comply with all City procurement rules and requirements.

The attached information is in response to questions posed at our department's hearing on November 1, 2019 to discuss the proposed 2020 budget.

Alderman Dowell requested information regarding corrective action that has been initiated with contractors.

Between January and October 2019, DPS received 13 requests from City departments to issue cure notices to vendors on City contracts. Three notices have been sent to date. One vendor received a notice to cure and two vendors received termination notices.
