The information below is a response to questions posed at the Chicago Police Department hearing on November 4, 2019 to discuss the proposed 2020 budget.

Alderman Sposato asked how often officers are required to recertify their training for use of force, taser and CIT.

In sum, use of force and taser training is required annually. CIT certified officers are required to recertify every three years. The requirements under state law and Department policy for these requirements are set forth below.

The Illinois Police Training Act prescribes annual training requirements for use of force training. See 50 ILCS 705/7.

"(h) Minimum in-service training requirements, which a police officer must satisfactorily complete at least annually. Those requirements shall include law updates and use of force training which shall include scenario based training, or similar training approved by the Board."

CPD's Special Order S11-10-01 implements this annual use of force requirement under the parameters below. The in-service training requirements are currently scaling up, with a minimum of 24 hours in 2019, 32 hours in 2020, and 40 hours beginning in 2021 and each year thereafter.

- "III. In-Service Training
- B. Department members must satisfactorily complete minimum in-service training requirements

annually. The requirements will include law updates, mental health awareness, firearms and weapons qualifications, use of force training including scenario-based training, or similar training approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board. Department members must satisfactorily complete any other Department-mandated training.

Paragraphs 99, 100, 101, 245, and 246 of the Consent Decree also set forth ongoing in-service training requirements for CIT, use of force, and tasers:

- "99. Within 365 days of the Effective Date, the CIT Program staff, in coordination with the Education and Training Division will develop the CIT Refresher Training. The CIT Program staff will review and revise the CIT Refresher Training as necessary to ensure that Certified CIT Officers receive up-to-date training. The CIT Program will seek input from the Advisory Committee in the development of the refresher training.
- 100. All Certified CIT Officers who completed the Basic CIT Training before the development of the CIT Refresher Training must complete their first CIT Refresher Training within four years of the date that the CIT Refresher Training is developed\*. All Certified CIT Officers who complete Basic CIT Training on or after the date that the CIT Refresher Training is developed must complete their first CIT Refresher Training within three years of receiving the Basic CIT Training.
- 101. Certified CIT Officers who fail to complete the CIT Refresher Training within three years of taking their most recently required CIT Training, whether the Basic CIT Training or a prior CIT Refresher Training, will be deemed out of compliance with the CIT Program's CIT Refresher Training requirement. CPD will confirm on a quarterly basis that Certified CIT Officers remain in compliance with the CIT Refresher Training requirement. Any Certified CIT Officer found to be out of compliance during the quarterly review may not continue to be identified by CPD as a Certified CIT Officer and may not continue to be prioritized to respond to calls for service involving individuals in crisis. Each quarter, CPD will inform OEMC of officers who are out of compliance with the CIT Refresher Training requirement must complete the most recently offered version of the CIT Refresher Training before CPD may resume identifying the officer as a Certified CIT Officer and before OEMC may resume prioritizing that officer to respond in the field to calls involving individuals in crisis.
- 245. CPD will provide all current CPD officers with in-service use of force training on at least an annual basis, and more frequently when necessitated by developments in applicable law and CPD policy. CPD will coordinate and review all use of force training to ensure quality, consistency, and compliance with federal and state law, CPD policy, and this Agreement.
- 246. The annual use of force training will include the following topics:
- a. CPD policies and Fourth Amendment law governing the use of force;
- b. proper use of force decision-making that utilizes a critical thinking framework in which officers gather relevant facts; assess the situation, threats, and risks; consider CPD policy; identify options and determine the best course of action; and act, review, and reassess the situation;
- c. role-playing scenarios and interactive exercises that illustrate proper use of force decision-making;
- d. ethical decision-making and peer intervention, principles of procedural justice, the role of implicit bias, and strategies for interacting with individuals in crisis;

- e. de-escalation techniques and tactics to prevent or reduce the need for force, including exercising persuasion and advice, and providing a warning; stabilizing the situation through the use of time, distance, or positioning to isolate and contain a subject; and requesting additional personnel to respond or make use of specialized units or equipment; the proper deployment of CPD-issued or -approved weapons or technologies, including firearms and Tasers;
- f. use of force reporting, investigation, and review requirements, including documenting reportable use of force incidents; and
- g. other topics as determined based on the training needs assessment required by this Agreement."

Alderman Osterman asked how the Chicago Police Department (CPD or the Department) intends on utilizing the vacant positions from the Office of Community Policing (OCP).

With regard to the elimination of 16 vacancies, it is important to know that these vacancies were unfilled and CPD is not reducing its current staffing. Beginning in 2018, the Office of Community Policing started to review the staffing needs in the context of CPAP recommendations, Consent Decree requirements, and the mission of the office. The result of the staffing review allowed OCP to hire 12 members:

One (1) Deputy Director

One (1) Area Coordinator

Three (3) Domestic Advocates

Seven (7) Community Organizers

The 2020 Budget Recommendations will allow OCP to continue to grow its team with the following 19 roles, pending final approval:

One (1) Community Policing (CAPS) Coordinator

One (1) Area Coordinator

One (1) Domestic Violence Advocate

Two (2) Compliance Officers

Three (3) Community Organizers

Three (3) Crime Victim Advocates (Grant)

Four (4) new Youth Service Coordinators

Four (4) new Information Coordinators

The Office of Community Policing's goal is to ensure that it has the resources to successfully accomplish its mission.

Alderman Waguespack asked for the overtime reduction plan for 2020.

The Police Department is implementing several strategies in 2020 to reduce overtime.

- A. Starting September 30, 2019 all Police Department employees must swipe In and Out at the start and end of their shifts. With the addition of the officers swiping we will be able to generate overtime reports within a week vs. two months, giving managers the ability to manage and review their overtime when the overtime in real time.
- B. All districts/units will receive a 2020 budget allotment for overtime.
  - a. Starting in 2020, each month each district/unit will receive an overtime report showing current expenditures vs. the budgeted amount and will be required to justify their overtime and explain why their overtime was above or below the projected amount.
- C. In addition to the monthly monitoring, overtime has been added to CompStat so commanders can justify their overtime and explain their strategy for when to use overtime.
- D. Overtime can only be approved by a District Commander or above.
- E. A Captain was assigned to the Courts at 26<sup>th</sup> and California to ensure the Bureau of Detectives personnel are not staying in court longer than necessary when a case has been continued or the prep has been completed.

CIT Officers are available in all police districts in the city of Chicago. Officers who have completed this 40-hour training are knowledgeable about the signs and symptoms of mental illness. They are trained how to interact, intervene, and de-escalate situations with persons in crisis and potentially in need of a psychiatric evaluation.

The following table provides the percent of calls dispatched by district as CIT related from 2016 to 2019.

From 2001 through 2018, there have been 51 women that were missing and/or found deceased/murdered. These women ranged in age from 18 to 58 years old. The breakdown of the race of each of women noted above are as follows:

African American: 39 Caucasian: 11 Hispanic: 1

The women were predominantly found in an abandoned building or outside. Twenty-one of the fifty-one cases have an unknown male DNA profile that was discovered via forensic analysis. All of the twenty-one unknown male DNA profiles belong to <a href="twenty-one different">twenty-one different</a> unknown males.

For a number of months, the FBI Violent Crimes Task Force, which consists of 10 Chicago Police Homicide Detectives, has been reviewing each of these 51 case files to ensure that every piece of evidence and investigative lead has been properly vetted and followed up on by the task force.

CPD employees were required to swipe in and out effective October 1, 2019 for both regular duty and overtime. The determination of when to swipe is based on a complex combination of attendance records of regular duty worked and overtime authorization records. In anticipation of the policy, CPD developed an electronic overtime request and approval system that was rolled out citywide Jan 1, 2019. CPD also developed a swipe reconciliation system that calculates expected swipe times and that began pilot testing in July 2019. Prior to the launch of that pilot, CPD has worked with the department of finance to receive a data stream from the CATA system which is used by the swipe reconciliation system to compare actual swipes with expected swipes for determining compliance. An interactive dashboard and a number of summary compliance reports have been developed to present this compliance data for use by CPD management.
