



Guided by the plan's 2 PRINCIPLES and 5 THEMES, We Will Chicago focuses on improving conditions and opportunities in 7 PILLARS.







PLANNING PHASE

Community focus groups and workshops held by the City and Metropolitan Planning Council (MPC) to establish themes and refine pillars.

RESEARCH & ENGAGEMENT PILOTS

2021

Pillar Research Teams met monthly to develop questions, objectives, and recommendations for the plan.

Artist-organizers also held nearly 80 events to pilot engagement activities and collected public input on the Plan Pillars.


A policy plan and a report on public feedback will be presented to Chicago Plan Commissioners.










VOLUNTEER LOCATIONS





Meeting-in-a-Box Pilot


- 20 organizations hosted their own meetings
