On Tuesday, January 19, at 6:00 p.m. CST, residents and businesses across Chicago are asked to turn off their lights and electronics, step outside their home or workplace, and light a candle in a moment of silence for those who have lost their lives to COVID-19. Following 10 minutes of reflection, everyone will turn the lights back on at 6:10 p.m. CST to symbolize moving from darkness to light.

"The past 12 months have been difficult for all of us, impacting us in ways past crises never have, sometimes with tragic consequences," said Mayor Lightfoot. "Yet, for all we have lost, we must also remember what we have gained – a deeper resilience and understanding of the extraordinary bonds that hold us together as a city and a nation. It is this light that will continue to guide us out of the darkness we have experienced and into the brilliant recovery that will be sure to come once we put this terrible pandemic behind us."
