2021 INDIVIDUAL ARTISTS PROGRAM GRANTS

Application Deadline is December 1 @ 5pm CST

Individual Artists Program (IAP) Grants support artists across all artistic disciplines including:

- Film & Media Arts
- Literary Arts
- Performing Arts (Theatre/Dance)
- Music
- Visual Arts & Design

As part of the extended Year of Chicago Music, the 2021 program will include special funding opportunities for musicians!

Performing Arts Venue Relief Program

- Application re-opens on November 19th, deadline is Thursday, December 3rd
- This program will provide \$10,000 grants to approximately 120 for-profit and nonprofit performing arts venues to cover lost revenue due to COVID-19.
- This includes venues that primarily produce theatre, dance, comedy, performance art and/or music, including live mixing by DJs.



Architecture Division: Housing

Using data from the <u>City of Chicago's Large Lots Program</u>, select an available lot in Auburn Gresham, Austin or Englewood and design an affordable, environmentally friendly, multi-unit housing structure that can support families or multi-generational households.

Submission Type: Architectural models (physical or digital) with supporting artifacts and documents to show your design process.



Construction Division: Mobility

To increase accessibility and comfort for visitors to the future <u>Auburn Gresham Healthy Lifestyle Hub</u>, a new bus shelter will replace the existing bench at the 79th & Peoria St. bus stop. To ensure timely completion & a safe construction site for both workers and the neighborhood, develop a construction management plan that describes the overall planning, coordination & control of the project.

Submission Type: Construction management plan with supporting artifacts and documents to show your design process.





Visual Arts Division: Community Building

Select a site and design a mural, sculpture, or other long-term art installation that celebrates the past, present, and possible future for Auburn Gresham, Austin or Englewood.

Submission Type: Design with supporting artifacts and documents to show your design process



Graphic Design Division: Open Space

Using data from the <u>City of Chicago's Large Lots</u> program, select an available lot for a community garden in Auburn Gresham, Austin or Englewood. Design a piece of print collateral that makes the case for the garden, demonstrating its potential benefits and encouraging community members and other stakeholders to get involved.

Submission Type: Print collateral (poster, brochure, magazine cover, infographic, etc.) with supporting artifacts and documents to show your design process





Open Design+Build Division: Social Impact

Select an available site (vacant lot or repurpose a building) in Auburn Gresham, Austin or Englewood. Propose a design for a multipurpose space that can support a farmer's market, food bank and healthy eating classes for the community.


Submission Type: Any combination of the options from other categories, plus digital media (video, podcast, etc.), with supporting artifacts and documents to show your design process.
