Overview



Over **25,700** new arrivals since August 2022 •Chartered Buses • Flights • Independent Travel



598 buses have arrived since August 2022488 buses since May 12, 2023



30 shelters have been utilized within City network27 in current operation across 21 Wards





Current Shelter Overview

13,777 current shelter residents

575 awaiting shelter at police stations and shelters

- 354 at CPD police stations
- 221 at O'Hare
- 38 buses arrived to Chicago in the last 7 days
- **1,586** people arrived to Chicago in the last 7 days
- 9 more buses than last week
- **7** buses expected on Wednesday, Dec. 13
- Impounding amendment in City Council

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- 93 buses in violation of ordinance since November 18
 - Up from 56 bus violations last week









Placed in shelter this week 630



people exiting our system in the last 7 days **1,396**



In comparison to last week, December 5th:

- 1,662 placed in shelter
- 796 exited shelter system



Resettlement

Catholic Charities Weekly Resettlement

- Move Outs = 130 households (414 individuals)
- New leases signed = 240
- Outmigration cases = 160





Police Stations

Retired police stations: 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 22, 24, 25 **Total:** 17

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Open police stations: 1, 6, 7, 12 Total: 4





- Bed availability increasing at shelter:
 - People exiting the shelter via resettlement, outmigration, or on their own
- Expansion at existing shelters
- Collaboration with faith based institutions
 - Unity Emergency Housing
- 22nd Ward Litte Village
 - 230 families expected at this shelter for 6 months
- Brick and mortar shelter
 - Multiple locations under assessment



- New arrivals who entered shelter in 2022 received a 60-day notice beginning 11/17/2023. There are approximately 30 people in this group.
- New arrivals who entered shelter between 1/1/2023 7/31/2023
 received their 60-day notices on 12/4/2023. There are approximately 1,767
 people currently in shelter who arrived in this time frame.
 - 1,767 (100% of all arrivals in this group) have officially received their notice.
- New arrivals who entered shelter between 8/1/2023 11/16/2023 will begin receiving 60-day notices on 2/1/2024.



RFP Updates

Shelter Operations RFP

- The RFP closed on Friday, October 6th.
- RFP evaluation is complete Award letters expected in a few weeks.

• Meals RFP

- 20 proposals received December 1st
- Two awards North and South Region
- Timeline
 - December 13: Complete initial RFP review
 - December 19 December 29: Oral presentations
 - Week of January 8, 2024: Award recommendations



Federal Coordination

- Working group with FEMA, county, and state agencies to support city response.
 - Bus drop-off outside of Chicago
 - Support from CDC: Awarded Chicago \$450,000 in operation and \$250,000 for vaccine (2,100 doses)
- Ongoing TPS workshops at city-run shelters
 - State exploring expansion outside of shelter system
 - 12/11 12/15 pre-workshop preparation with shelter residents for Sprint 2 next week.
 - 20-30 days for approvals
 - 12/7 750 EAD via paroled completed and 283 TPS.
