




An estimated 30,000+ asylum seekers have arrived in Chicago since Aug 31st, 2022

As of January 23, the City has 14,241 clients in 28 shelters.

New Arrivals Shelter Census

There are **14,241** shelter residents in **28** active shelters, across **21** Wards.

NOTE: The census numbers are updated daily and can fluctuate due to resettlement, finding housing independently, onward movement, rogue bus drop-offs, among other factors. Additionally, the bus numbers are fluid and can change.

- State
 - State is announced funding for Illinois Welcoming Centers and a new RFP for municipalities (other than Chicago) to support new arrivals.
 - Ongoing discussion about funding or standing up shelter beds.
- County
 - Ongoing conversations and planning with Cook County to open St. Barts.
 - Cook County EMRS can redeploy our assigned staff members from Chicago EOC to landing zone.
- Federal
 - FEMA Region 5 starting a planning cell in EOC consisting of all levels of government (OEMC, EMRS, IEMA, FEMA) - Ongoing.
 - Assisting OEMC with supply chain requests to support at shelters.
 - Cots, blankets, and other essential items



- Advocacy by Mayor Johnson
 - Mayor Johnson convened Mayors from other municipalities across the state to share the latest updates and advocate for more coordination.
 - Mayor Johnson traveled to DC for the U.S. Conference of Mayors to make another push for funding to support the mission.
- City Council's Committee on Immigrant Rights
 - Will meet next Tuesday at 9:00 am City Council chambers
- Towing Amendment
 - **215 rogue buses** have dropped in roughly 30+ towns in 9+ Illinois Counties in the Chicagoland Region.
 - Townships and Municipalities have also implemented similar ticketing and towing enforcements. New Arrivals being dropped at outlying locations are traveling into Chicago via train and into main transportation hubs (Union Station, Ogilvie, etc.)
- Multi Agency and Multi-Jurisdictional Planning Cell
 - Coordinating efforts to solve supply chain gaps and planning for upcoming challenges.
 - Immediate Incident Stabilization
 - Supply Chain Resiliency, Planning and Operations



- Due to the National Weather Service (NWS) issued warnings the City used the OEMC Emergency Operations Plan to open Harold Washington Library at 400 S. State St opened the lower level as a 24/7 warming center for anyone in need.
- As of this week, Harold Washington was deactivated, and Operations for the Landing Zone returned to 800 S Desplaines location.
 - Warming buses are on site at the landing zone
 - Meals and donations will be coordinated by OEMC with the support of New Life and the new meals vendor
- Warming areas will be available when temperatures are at 32 degrees or below warming areas are available at the City's six community service centers from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Management (OEMC)

Medical (CDPH)

- Coordinating medical providers' mobile units to support with medical intakes
- Medical triage- 3 layers of care
- Personnel from CDPH-funded healthcare partners
- Partners providers follow-up care
- Federally Qualified Health Center partners


AmeriCorps VISTA
