

This memorandum is in response to your request for information on the Chicago Police Department's emergency purchase request for carbines and related equipment.

As you are aware, the Chicago Police Department has implemented a Police Carbine Program. I directed the Department to undertake this effort as quickly as could be done in a safe and effective manner, after discovering the insufficient capabilities of our first responding officers to many life threatening events. The high level of violence that is being directed on the streets of the City against both our citizens and our officers, as well as the possibility of active shooters in schools, work places and other public venues clearly mandates that this program be implemented as soon as possible.

I further directed our Department to ensure that we thoroughly research all of the carbines and equipment, to ensure that the very best and most appropriate equipment was ordered and that the cost was at or below what would be expected. I am now satisfied that we have selected the best and most appropriate equipment for the Department and the City of Chicago.

Our officers frequently face life and death confrontations in which their handguns are inadequate. This summer, our officers have come under fire and have been pinned down, in cases where the presence of the carbines could have given them the tactical advantage. In other situations, officers have come under heavy and sustained fire and it was through the effective use of the carbine that the threat was neutralized; in one instance two officers were shot – one in the chest – and it was a direct result of the use of carbines that more officers were not injured, and citizens were protected. These instances reflect the level of gun violence throughout much of the city, which threatens not only our officers but the citizens of Chicago. Our officers understand that they are outgunned and

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they are demanding the carbines to protect themselves and to carry out their mission.

We have completely revised our plans for active shooter incidents, which require a more effective role from our first responding officers. This can only be carried out by officers who are armed with carbines. There is no question that the ability to protect the lives of the citizens of Chicago against armed offenders will be greatly increased with the presence of carbines. Every day that we delay puts our citizens at increased risk.

Accordingly, I am seeking two emergency purchase orders for this program. One order represents the carbines and the second order represents all of the related equipment, including the vehicle gun locks, training equipment and safety equipment. All of these items are required in order to safely implement the Police Carbine Operator's Program.

Each day that we delay puts the safety and welfare of our officers and our citizens in jeopardy. Accordingly, I am requesting your assistance to approve the emergency purchases for this program.
