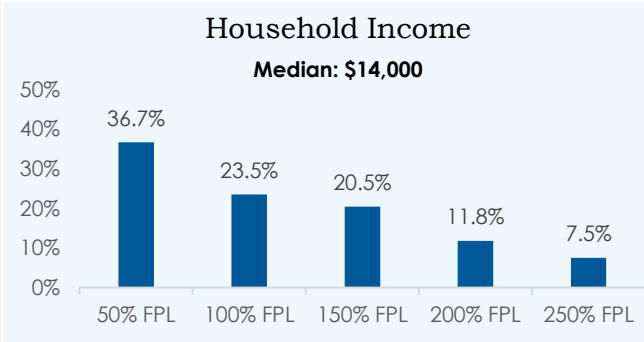
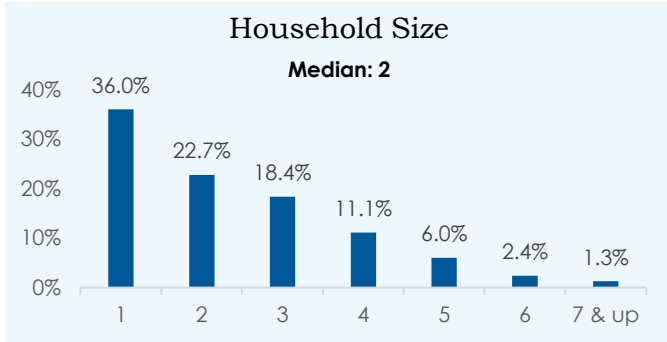
# Executive Summary

- The pilot is fully enrolled at just over 5,000 households.
- Like the applicants, the participants are majority female (71%), Black (68%), living in poverty (60%), and have caregiving responsibilities (63%).
- The median household income rose slightly from \$13,548 to \$14,000.
- SNAP, Medicaid, CHIP, Chicago Housing Authority housing or vouchers, and disability income (SSI and SSDI) are the most currently utilized benefits.

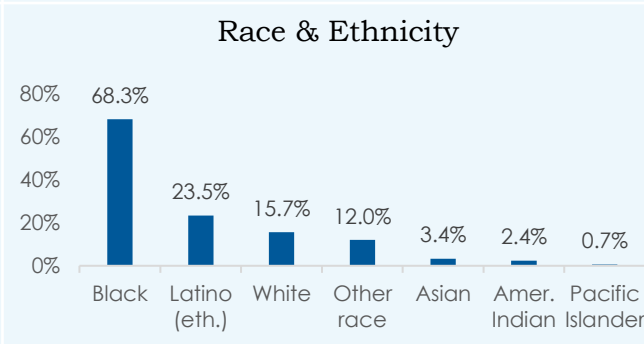
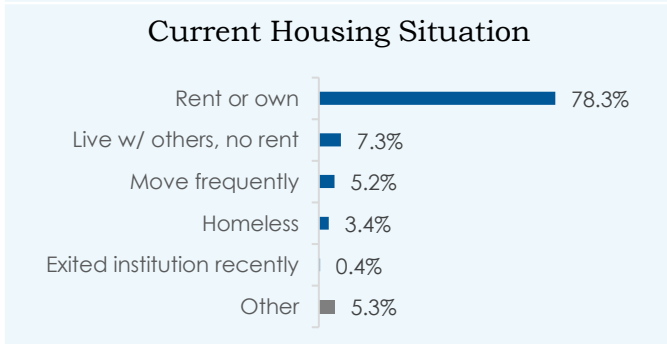
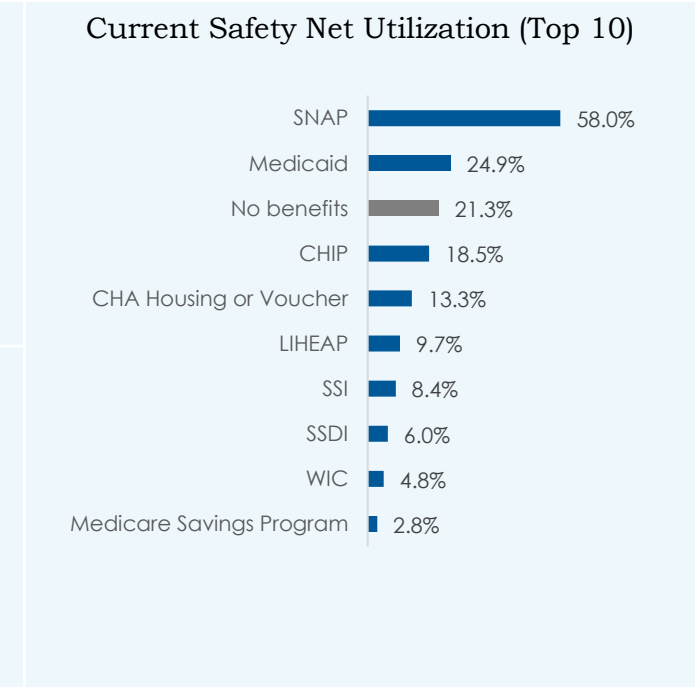
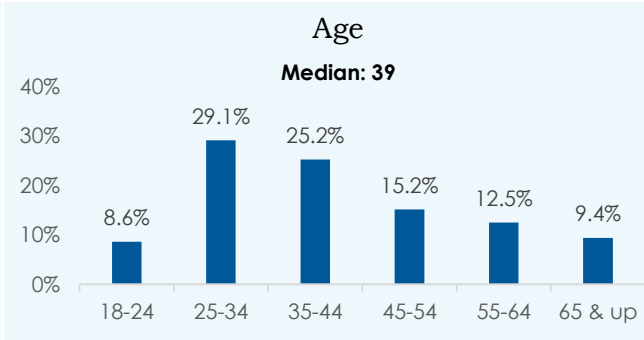
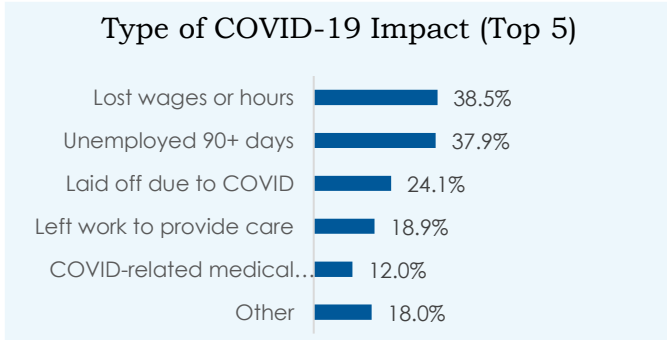


# Key Data: Participant Demographics

Total Enrolled: 5,006



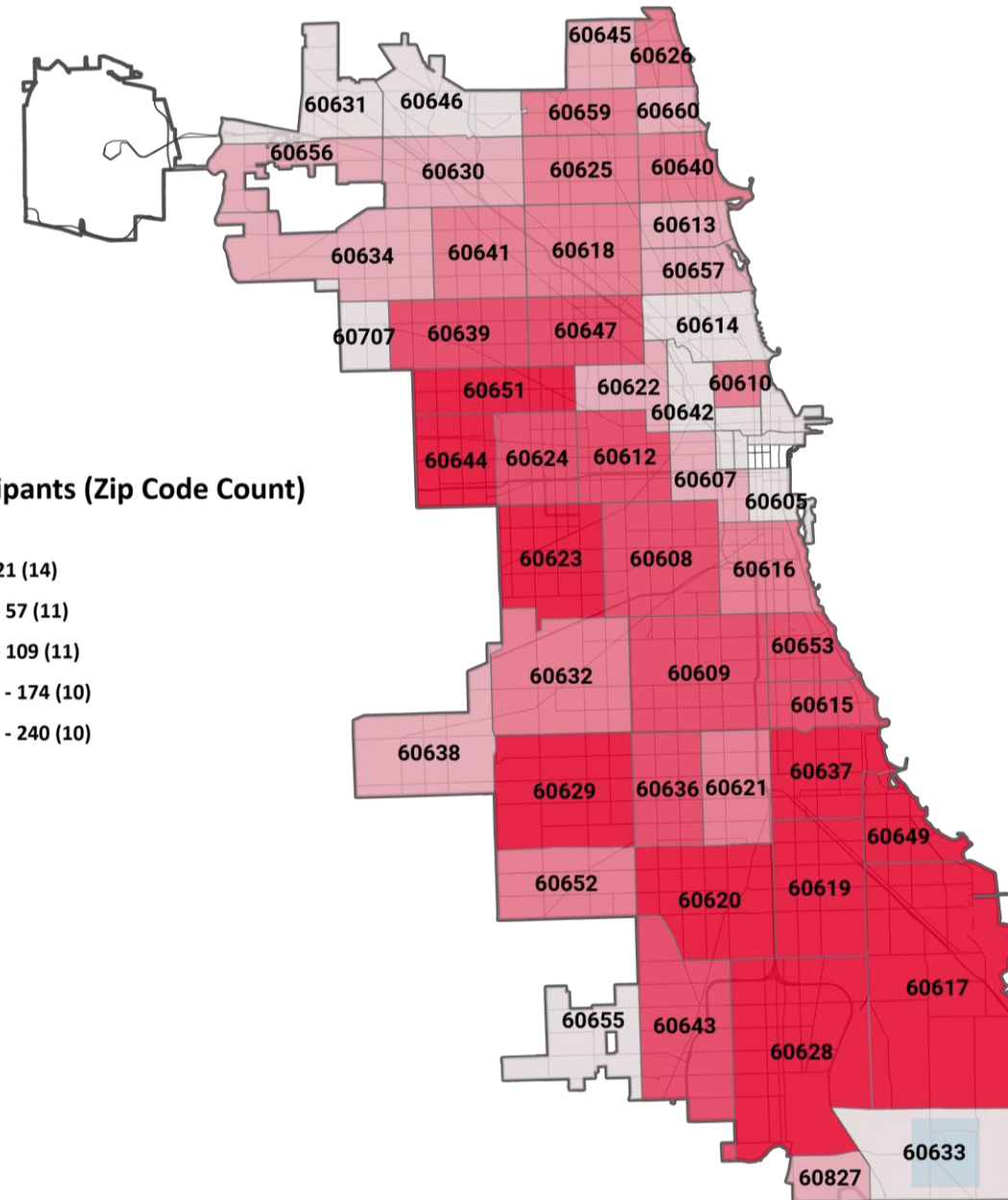
- ### Other Applicant Demographics
- 75.6% live in a medium or high economic hardship community (UIC index)
  - 71.1% identify as female
  - 62.5% identify as a caregiver

August 2022



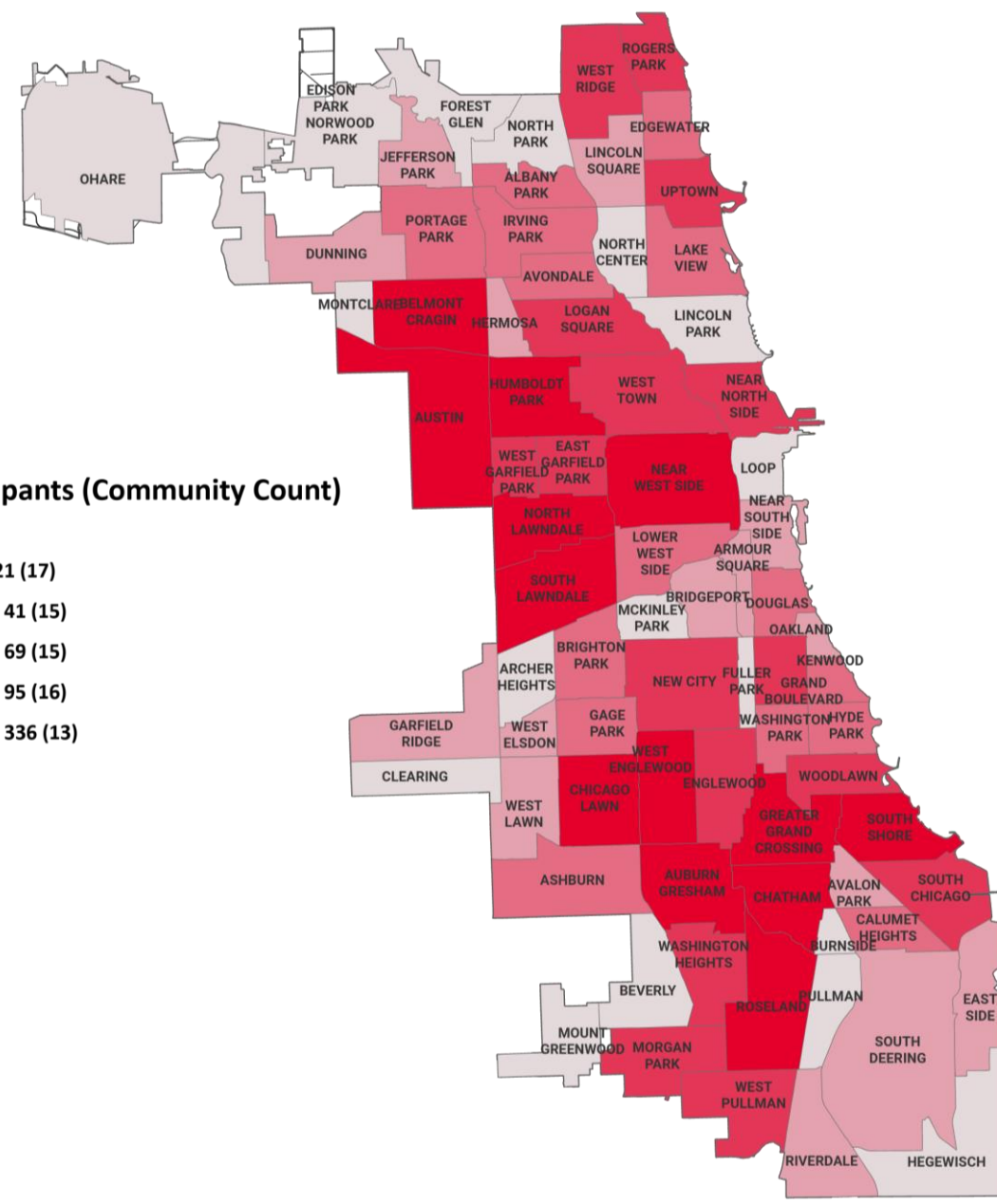

# Map: Participants by Community Area

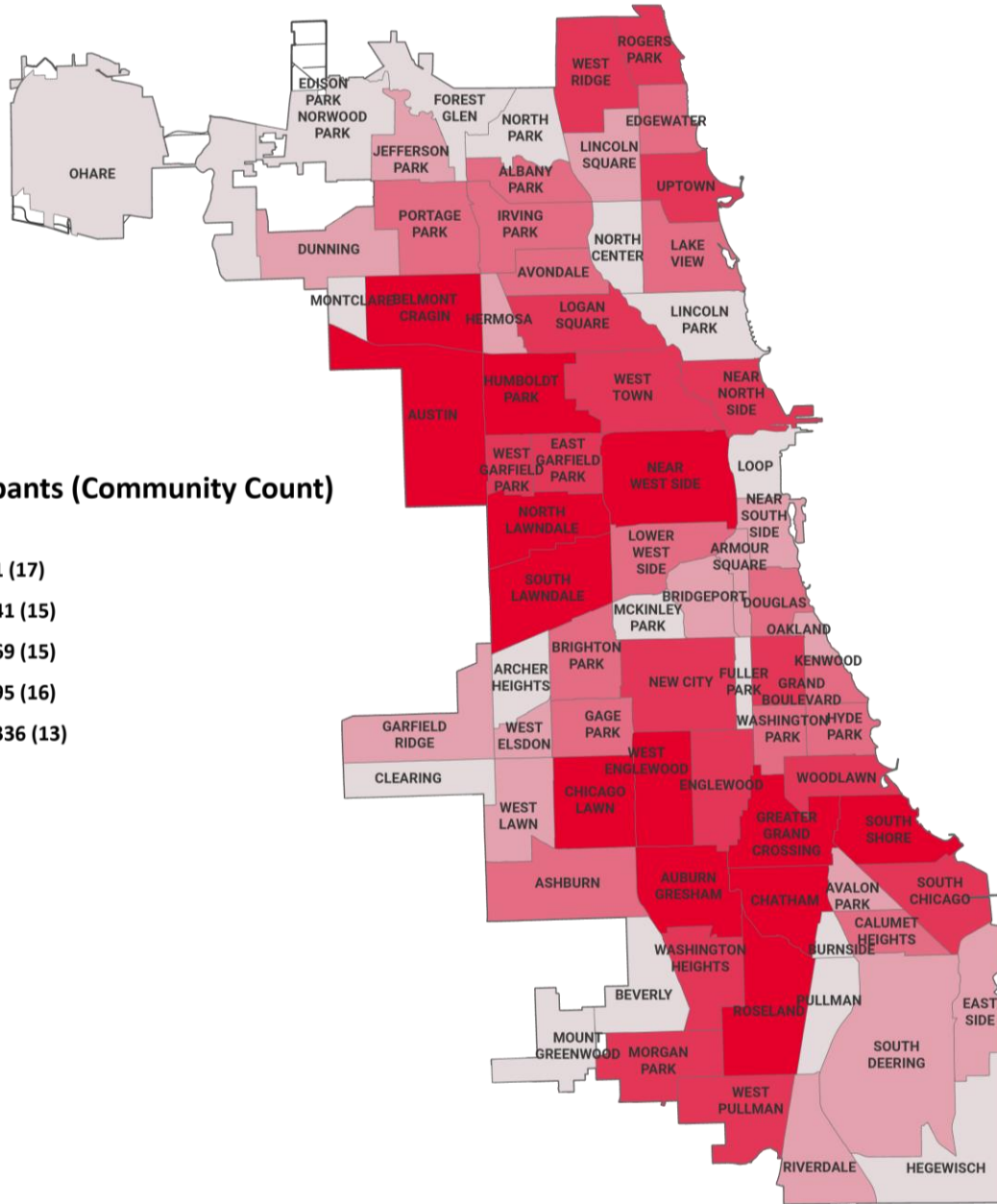
Participants by Community Area

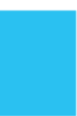

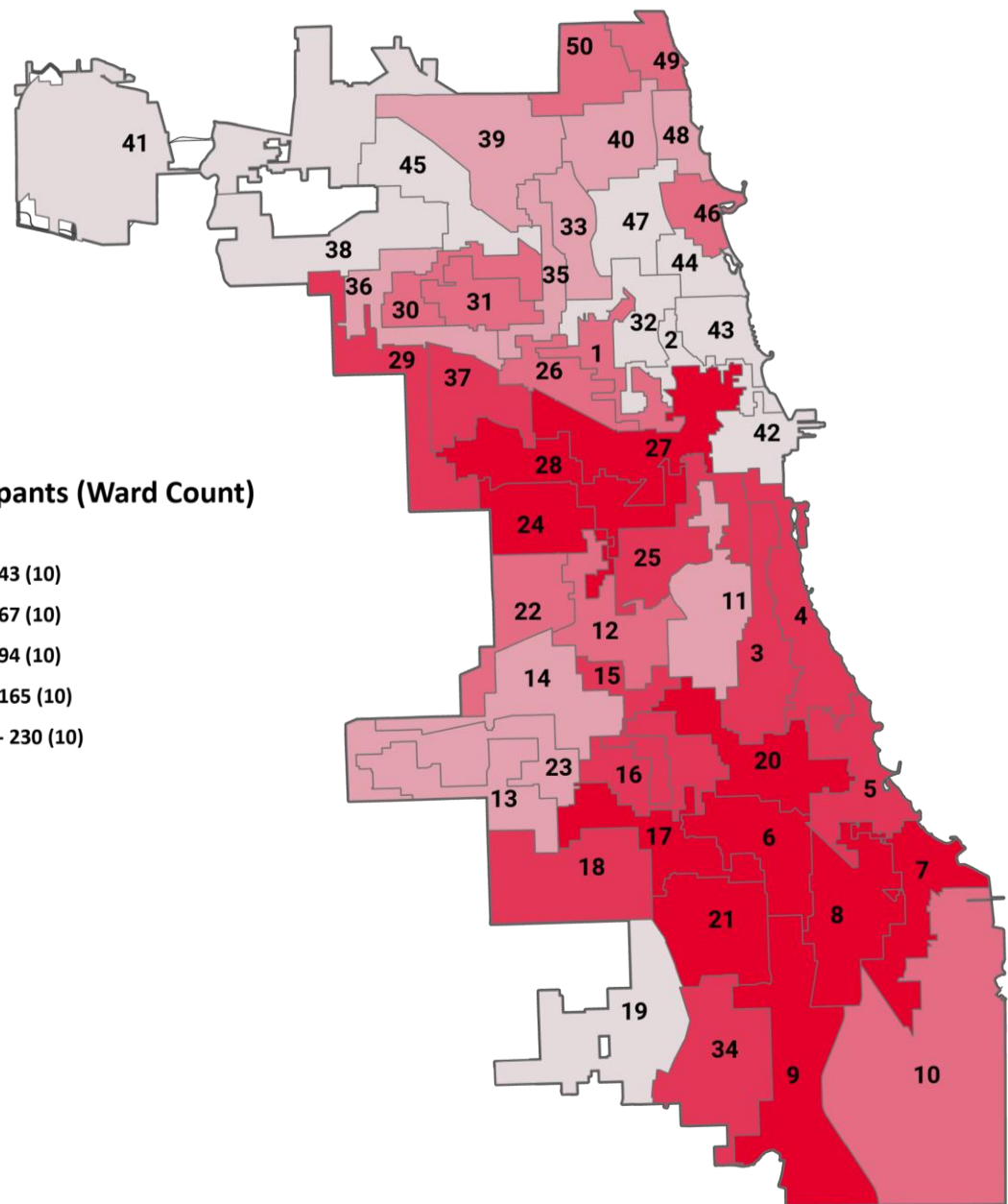
