

Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA)

All Federal grants obligated on or after October 1, 2010, must meet the terms and conditions of the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (FFATA) and the new requirements established by the federal Office of Management and Budget. As a prime recipient of federal funds, the Departments of Planning and Development and the Department of Housing are required to collect sub-award and executive compensation information from sub-recipients for entry into a publicly searchable online database. Your agency is considered a federal sub-recipient and is therefore required to provide the sub-recipient information below for each federally funded contract you receive.
