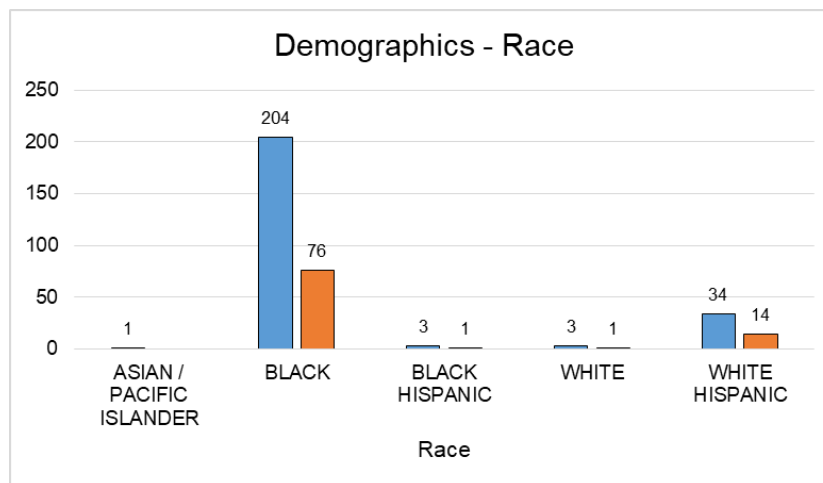
Summary

- In September 2020, 92 young people have been processed at JISC, which is 62 percent fewer than the 245 during the same period in 2019.
 - One young person was referred to SGA case management and 12 were released to adult.
- Motor vehicle theft (28) and Drug abuse violations (20) were the most frequent JISC-processed arrest charges in September 2020.
- Compared to September 2019 there were decreases in the proportion of youth released to adult (13% of all instances or 12 cases in 2020 and 26% of instances in 2019) and youth referred to SGA case management (1% of instances or 1 case in 2020 and 11% of instance or 26 cases in 2019).
- The community areas with the most JISC processed arrests were the Austin (15 youth) and Humboldt Park (22 youth).
- Approximately 33% of young people had no prior arrest in September 2020 and 2019. For the year following their JISC-processed arrest in September 2019, 186 youth (or 76%) were not re-arrested in the following year.
- The most common arrival hours in September 2020 were 11am-2pm and 6-9pm. JISC arrivals were fairly steady throughout the week with Monday being the most frequent and a slight decrease on Tuesdays and Sundays.
- Across the city for all JISC districts during both the 2019 and 2020 periods, most youth were in transit (between arrest and arrival at JISC) for less than 90 minutes, with 30-59 minutes being the most common.
- Alternate dispositions (referred to as “overrides” in the OIG report) are not consistently collected by CPD at this time. CPD is updating data collection methods to improve quality and specifically ensure alternate dispositions, approval, and the explanations are documented before 2021.

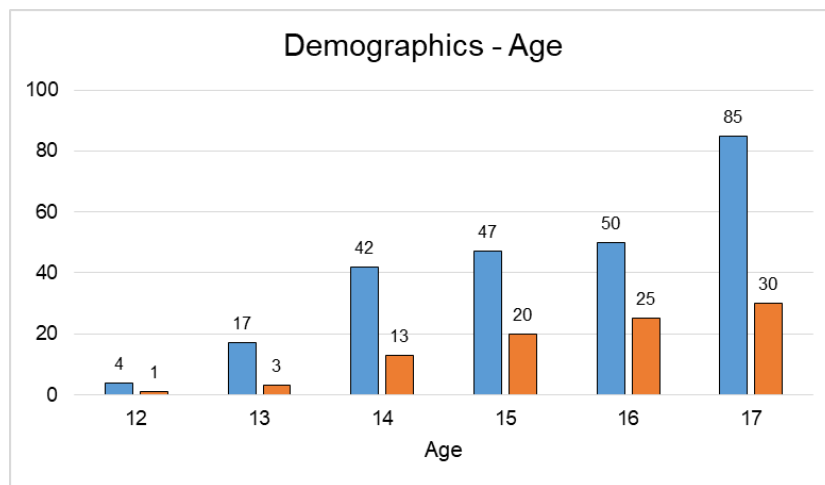
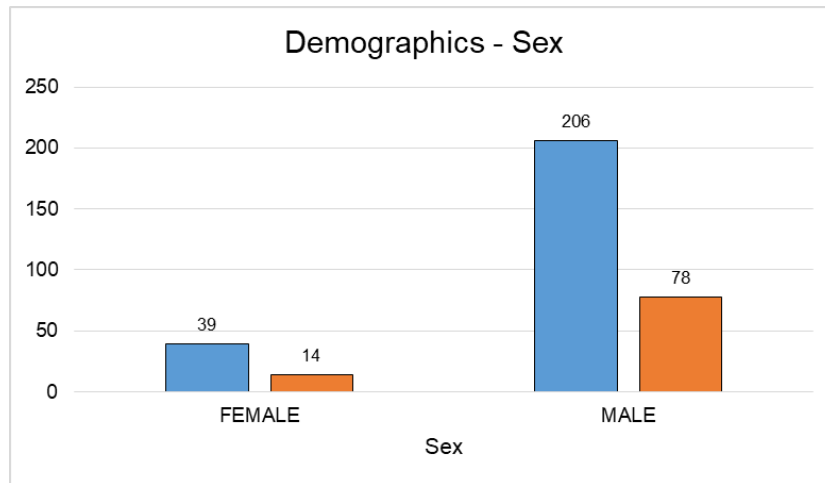
In this period during 2020, the majority of those who have interacted with JISC are Black, male, or 16-17 years old.

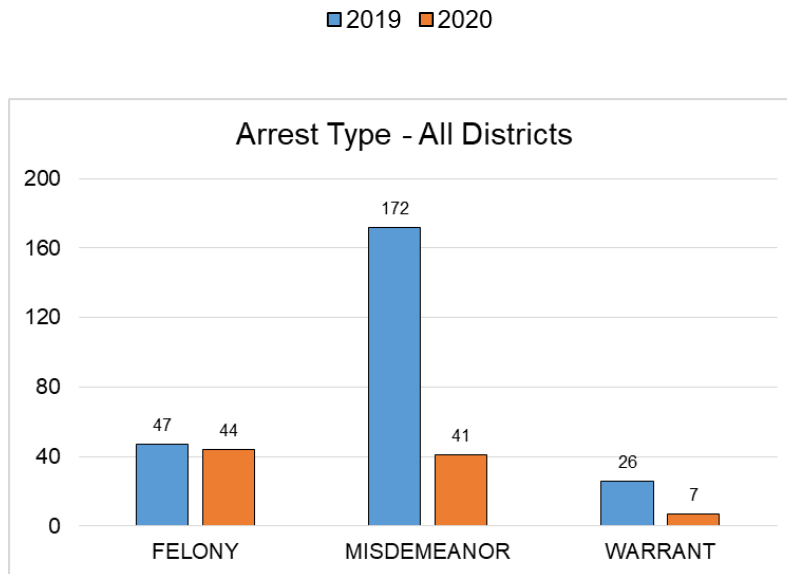

3. Disposition Data

The proportion of notable Disposition outcomes from September 2020 is consistent with the prior six months. Of the most common disposition outcomes in September 2020, the most prominent were court referrals (40% or 37 referrals) and detained (23% or 21 cases), which is consistent with earlier this year. Meanwhile, compared to September 2019 there were decreases in the proportion of youth released to adult (13% of all instances or 12 cases in 2020 and 26% of instances in 2019) and youth referred to SGA case management (1% of instances or 1 case in 2020 and 11% of instance or 26 cases in 2019).

In September 2020, the 11th and 9th districts were the most common arrest location for youth processed at JISC as compared to the 10th and 11th districts in 2019. All districts experienced a decrease as compared to 2019 and the 2nd and 03rd districts saw the most significant decrease in location of youth arrests who result in being processed at JISC, with approximately 90% reductions.

In September 2020, the Austin (15 youth) and Humboldt Park (22 youth) community areas were the most common arrest location for youth processed at JISC. While during the same period in 2019, Austin and North Lawndale were most common (with 26 youth each). Community areas that saw an increase in JISC-processed arrests from this period in 2020 to 2019 are Greater Grand Crossing (from 1 to 5) and Humboldt Park (from 20 to 22).

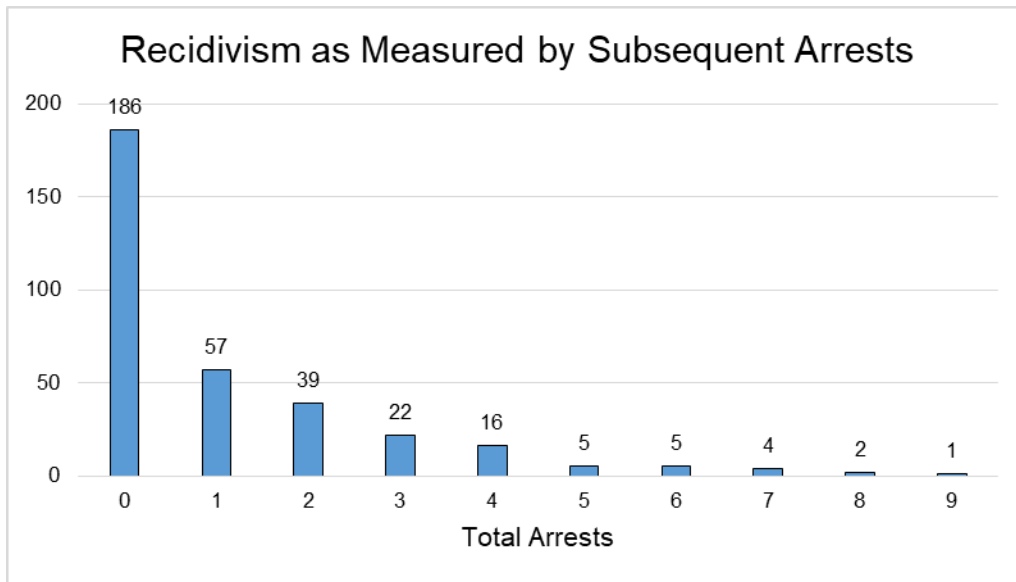
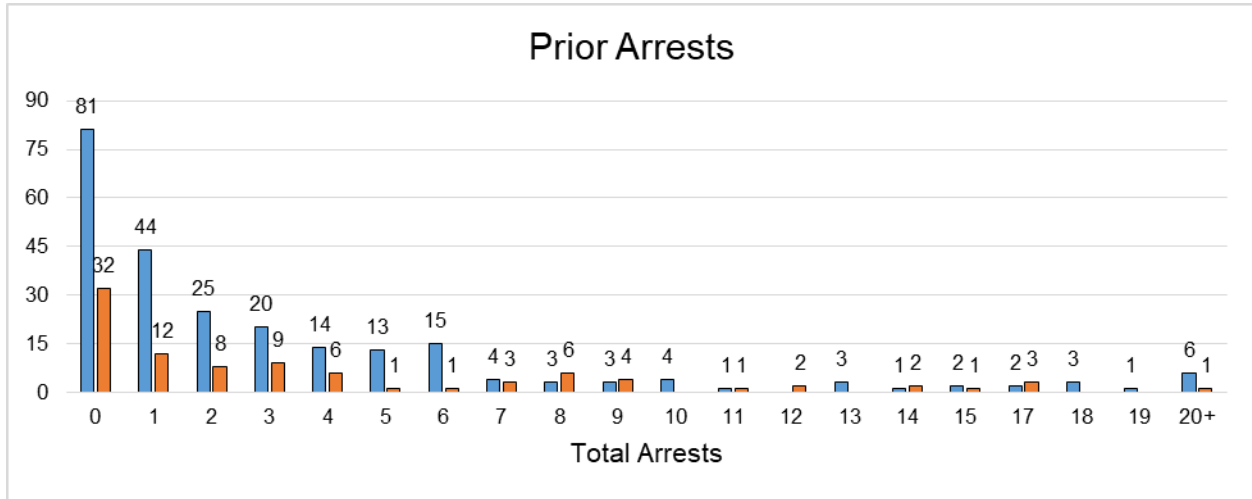

4. Re-arrest Rates²

September 2019 and 2020 saw similar trends of most youth having few prior arrests (approximately 33% of young people had no prior arrest in 2020 and 2019). For the year following their JISC-processed arrest 186 youth (or 76%) were not re-arrested in the following year.

² Prior arrest counts are based on an individual's total number of arrests at the time they are processed at the JISC. Next year recidivism rate counts are based on the number of times an individual processed at the JISC from September 1, 2019 - September 30, 2019 was arrested from any point after the date of the initial arrest during the 12 month period to September 30, 2020.

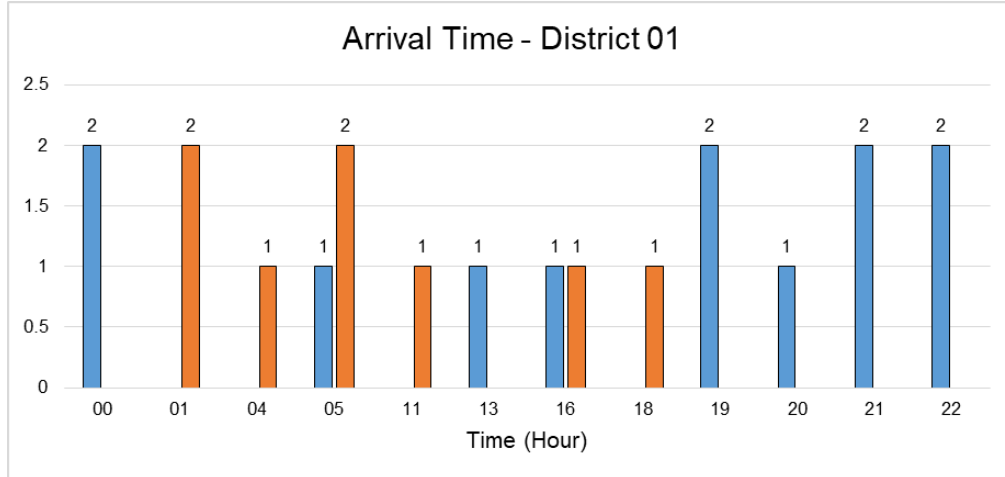
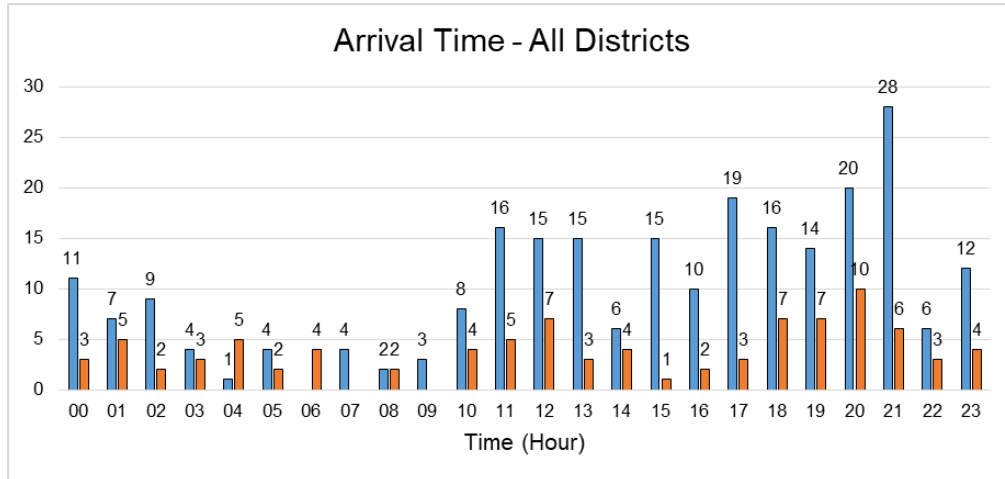

5. JISC Arrival Date and Time³ By District

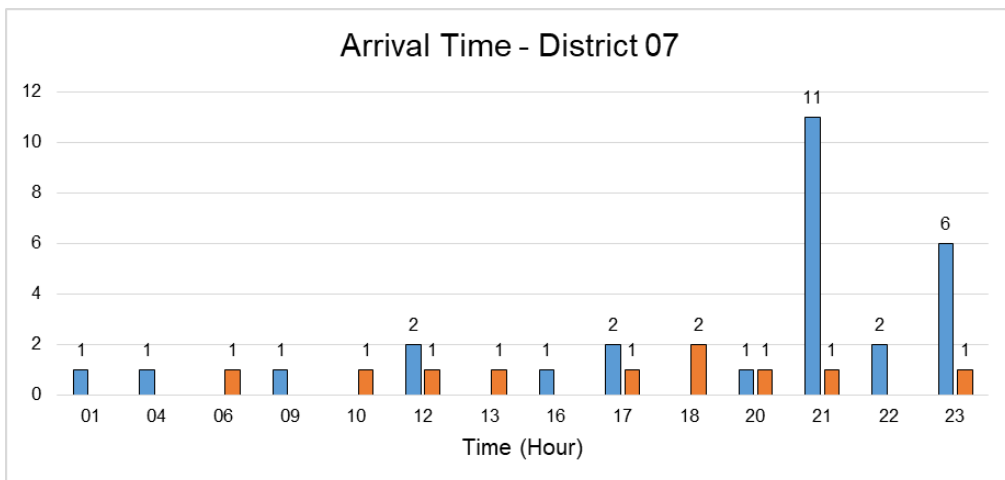
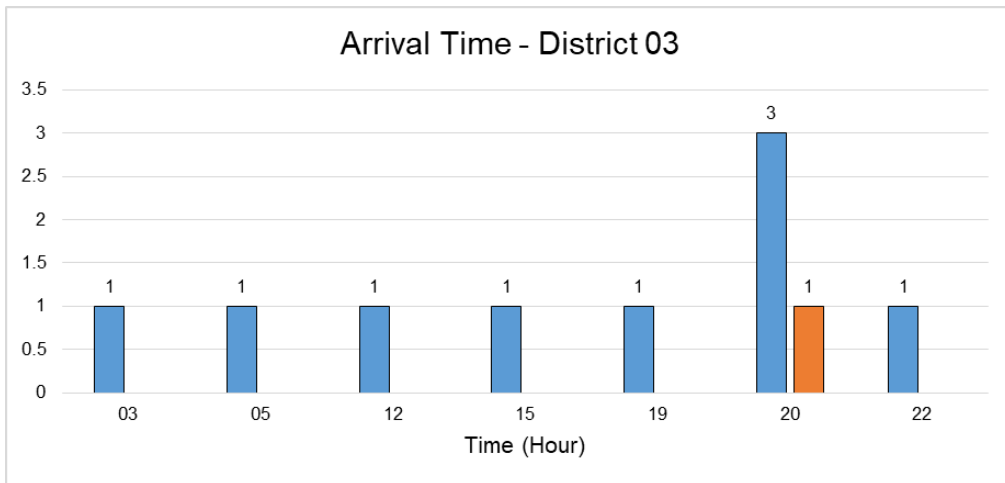
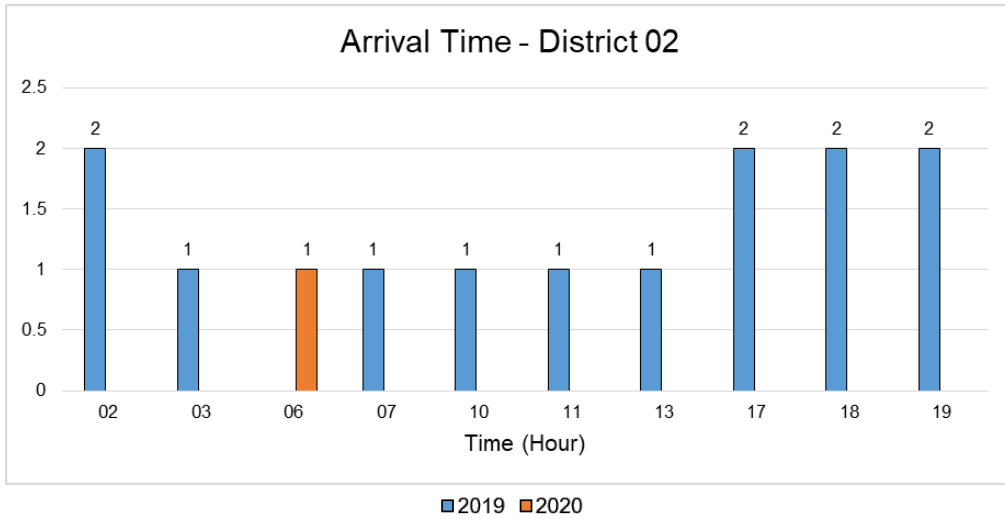

6. Movement Time^{4,5} By District

While a youth’s movement time before arriving at JISC is the responsibility of CPD patrol officers in each district, this analysis provides context for potential broader changes with youth interactions across CPD. Across the city for all JISC districts during both the 2019 and 2020 periods, most youth were in transit (between arrest and arrival at JISC) for less than 90 minutes, with 30-59 minutes being the most common. In September 2020, District 9 has the most youth who were transported for the longest time with 6 youth whose movement was between 120-149 minutes (2-2.5 hours).
